A Global Think Tank Founded to Guide the Korean Economy

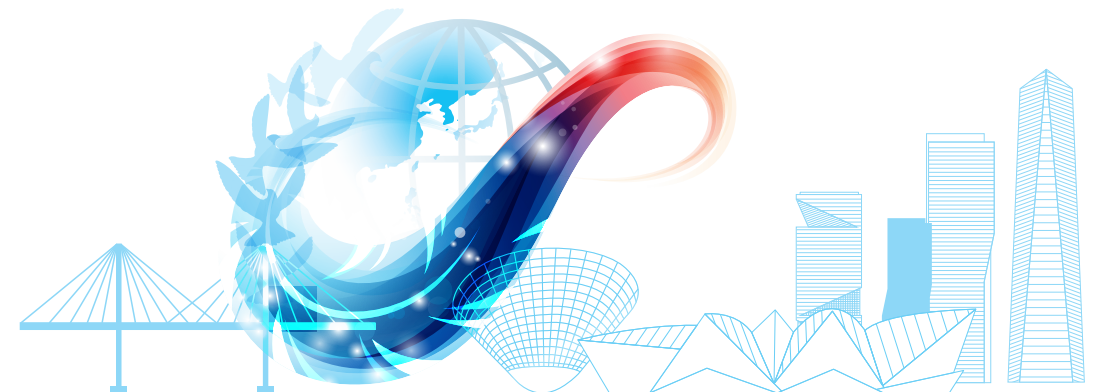

Welcome to the 2020 DMZ International Forum on the Peace Economy.

We are pleased to invite you to the 2020 DMZ International Forum on the Peace Economy, hosted by the Korea Institute for International Economic Policy (KIEP) and the National Research Council for Economics, Humanities, and Social Sciences (NRC) to be held on December 3-4, 2020 in Incheon, Republic of Korea.

This year 2020 marks the 70th anniversary of the start of the Korean War and 20th anniversary of June 15 South-North Joint Declaration, symbolizing the state of division and peace on the Korean Peninsula. As North Korea participated in the 2018 Pyeongchang Winter Olympics, held the inter-Korean summit and had the historic first summit between North Korea and the U.S., the Korean Peninsula embarked on a new journey toward peace and prosperity. However, the resumption of the inter-Korean and North Korea-U.S. cooperation has been placed on hold due to the COVID-19 pandemic and a combination of international situation.

Our speakers will address the issues of resolving the state of division on the Korean Peninsula, establishment of permanent peace and a virtuous circle with the economy based on this peace. Scholars and experts in the areas of global peace, security and economy will engage in focused discussions on the issues to explore solutions toward the establishment of peace and prosperity on the Peninsula.

On December 3, the Korean Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) Site Visit was scheduled to be held to appreciate the realities of division and the need to secure peace on the Peninsula. However, it has been replaced with online live broadcast because social distancing level has been raised in the greater Seoul area. On December 4, former Prime Minister of Japan Yukio Hatoyama, Mayor of Incheon Metropolitan City Park Namchoon, and many other distinguished participants will exchange their views on the establishment of peace on the Korean Peninsula, a peace-driven economy, U.S. new administration's East Asian policies and peace process on the Korean Peninsula, and prospects for Inter-Korean Relations in 2021.

Due to health considerations as the COVID-19 pandemic continues, we have expanded our online platform to allow more guests to participate from a distance. It is our great pleasure to invite you to the 2020 DMZ International Forum on the Peace Economy.

올해 포럼은 남북한 접경도시 인천에서 '장벽을 넘어 평화와 번영으로(Overcoming the Barriers: Towards Peace and Prosperity)'를 주제로 한반도 분단체제의 해소, 항구적인 평화 정착, 평화를 기반으로 한 경제와의 선순환을 위한 해법과 지혜를 모을 예정입니다. 전 세계 평화·안보·경제 분야 석학과 전문가의 구체적인 논의를 통해 한반도 평화와 번영에 한 걸음 다가갈 수 있기를 기대합니다.

1일차(12월 3일)에는 해외 저명인사와 국내외 외교 공관 인사, 한반도 문제 전문가들이 DMZ 현장을 함께 걸으며 한반도 분단의 현실과 평화 정착의 필요성을 몸소 체험할 예정이었지만, 코로나19 방역단계 격상에 따라 불가피하게 유튜브 라이브 방송으로 대체하게 되었습니다. 2일차(12월 4일)에는 하토야마 前 일본총리, 박남춘 인천광역시장 등을 모시고 한반도 평화 정착 및 평화경제, 미국 행정부의 동아시아 정책, 2021년 남북관계 전망 등을 토론할 예정입니다.

올해는 코로나19 방역을 위해 많은 분들을 현장에 직접 모시는 대신 온라인을 통해 참여하실 수 있도록 준비했습니다. 「2020 DMZ 평화경제 국제포럼」이 더욱 의미 있는 행사가 될 수 있도록 여러분의 많은 관심과 참여를 부탁드립니다.

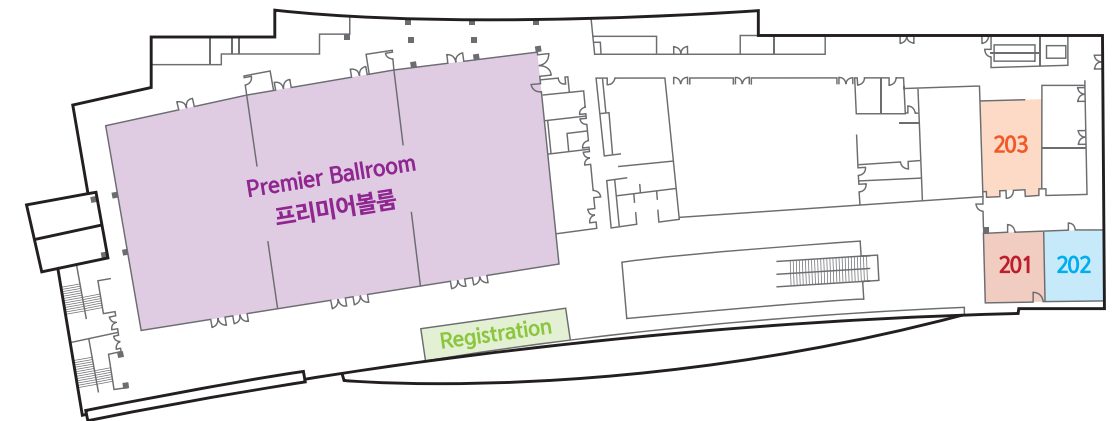

Andrey BYSTRITSKIY

Chairman, Board of the Foundation for Development and Support of the Valdai Discussion Club, Russia

In 1985–1991, Andrey BYSTRITSKIY was engaged in research as a Senior Fellow at the Academy of Pedagogical Sciences. He has been in the media industry since 1991, starting as the Head of the Audience Research Department of the All-Russia State Television and Radio Company (RTR), author and host of radio and television broadcasts. In 1993–1996, BYSTRITSKIY headed sociological research at the Company. From 1996 to 1997, he was in charge of the "Society" Department at the Itogi (Russian Newsweek) magazine. In 1997–1998, BYSTRITSKIY was Deputy Director General for Information at TV Tsentr. Between 1998 and 1999, he was the Producer of the Russian news service on BBC. In 1999, he joined the Organizing Committee of the Unofficial Moscow Festival as one of its Co-Chairs, he was also a member of the Editorial Board of the Moscow Alternative newspaper and Chairman of the Mayak State Radio Broadcasting Company (main information radio in Russia). In 2000, BYSTRITSKIY became the Director General of the Vesti State Television Company (an entity of RTR).

From 2000 to 2008, he was Deputy Director General of RTR and the Director of the Department of Information Programmes of the Russia TV. In 2000–2013 BYSTRITSKIY was a member of the Board of Directors and Vice President of international broadcasting company Euronews. Between 2005 and 2007, he was the Editor-in-Chief of the Apologia monthly magazine. From 2008 to 2014, he was the Chairman of the Voice of Russia State Radio Company (Russian international broadcaster in 44 languages).

Andrey BYSTRITSKIY has been at the National Research University – Higher School of Economics since 2001, as a Dean of the Faculty of Communications, Media and Design since 2014. Since 2008, he has been the head of the Council of the Heads of Government and Public Television and Radio Organizations of CIS Countries. Since 2014, BYSTRITSKIY has been the Chairman of the Board of the Foundation for Development and Support of the Valdai Discussion Club and the Chairman of the Public Supervisory Council of the Russian Ministry of Communications.

Andrey BYSTRITSKIY is a Professor and PhD (Pedagogics, 1989). He is a member of the Union of Writers. In June 2007, he received the Order of Honour.

Andrey BYSTRITSKIY is the author of books, including such works as Youth Subcultures and Russia's Intelligentsia During the Demise of the Soviet System (1991), and numerous publications in newspapers and magazines.



Thomas GOMART

Director, French Institute of International Relations, France

Dr. Thomas GOMART (Ph. D. in History at Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne, and EMBA at HEC) is Director of Ifri. He previously was its Vice President for Strategic Development (2010–2015) and the Director of its Russia/NIS Centre (2004–2013).

Before joining the think tank industry, GOMART was a scholar (Assistant Professor at La Sorbonne, 1996–1999), a cadet officer in the Army (2000), and a policy entrepreneur (2001–2004). Joining Ifri in 2004, he set up the Russia/NIS centre. His academic and professional background has been closely related to post-Soviet space, but also to wider international issues (security, energy, and digital governance). As Lavoisier Fellow at the State Institute for International Relations (University-MGIMO – Moscow), Visiting Fellow at the Institute for Security Studies (European Union – Paris) and Marie Curie Fellow at the Department of War Studies (King's College – London), GOMART has acquired a diversified international experience.

As Researcher, he is currently working on Russia, digital governance, country risk, and think tanks. He recently published *Notre intérêt national. Quelle politique étrangère pour la France?* (ed., with Thierry de Montbrial), Editions Odile Jacob, 2017; *L'effolement du monde – 10 enjeux géopolitiques*, Editions Tallandier, 2019 (Prix Louis Marin and Prix du Livre de Géopolitique); "What Is A Think Tank? Thomas GOMART has been a member of the Strategic Review Committee on the Strategic Review of Defence and National Security 2017 (French Ministry of Armed Forces). He is a member of the scientific committee of the Institute of Advanced Studies in National Defence (IHEDN). He is also a member of the editorial board of the French journals *Politique étrangère*, *Etudes*, and *Revue des deux mondes*.

HATOYAMA Yukio

Former Prime Minister of Japan

Born on Feb. 11 1947, Yukio HATOYAMA is the 93rd Prime Minister of Japan (2009–10). He belongs to the Hatoyama family which had produced four generations of politicians including his grandfather, Ichiro Hatoyama, who served as Prime Minister between 1954 and 1956.

Yukio HATOYAMA was educated as an engineer, earning a bachelor's degree at the University of Tokyo (1969) and a doctorate at Stanford University (1976). He taught at Senshu University in Tokyo since 1981 and began his own political career as a member of the Liberal Democratic Party, winning election in 1986 to the House of Representatives as a member from Hokkaido. In 1996, he joined the newly formed Democratic Party of Japan (DPJ), serving as Co-Leader. He became President of DPJ from 2009 and he served as Japan's 93rd Prime Minister from September 2009 to June 2010. He also received Order of Friendship of Russian Federation in 2011 as well as Vietnam Friendship Medal in 2013.

Since leaving the frontline politics, Yukio HATOYAMA has remained active in private sector. He is currently President of East Asian Community Institute (EACI) since May 2013. He also serves various positions such as President of Yuai Foundation, Honorary Advisor of International Academic Society for Asian Community and Supreme Advisor of Japan–Russia Society.



JEONG Se Hyun

Executive Vice–Chairperson, The National Unification Advisory Council /
Former Minister of Unification, Republic of Korea

JEONG Se-hyun currently is Chairman of the Board in Korea Peace Forum and now he serves as the Executive Vice–Chair of National Unification Advisory Council from September 2019.

He spent more than two decades at the Ministry of Unification which he first joined as a researcher on communist countries at then–Board of National Unification in 1977. In 2002 he was appointed as the head of the Ministry and assumed the post until June 2004 serving two consecutive Presidents, Kim Dae-jung and Roh Moo-hyun. He was also credited with boosting inter–Korean cooperative projects including Kaesong Industrial Region, a landmark site of Inter–Korean cooperation. He also worked at Korean think tanks – now–Sejong Institute and Korea Institute for National Unification – as their ranking member.

In addition, he was the visiting scholar to Kyung Hee University and Myongji University as well as the Endowed–Chair Professor of Ewha Womans University and Kyungnam University. Moreover, he previously served as the 11th President of Wonkwang University and the 6th President of Korean Council for Reconciliation and Cooperation, one of South Korean NGOs that most actively engage with North Korea.

He holds three degrees from Seoul National University: bachelor in political science and diplomacy and master and doctorate in international relations. He focused his postgraduate studies on Chinese studies earning master for analysing Han Fei, a Chinese philosopher, and doctorate for Mao Zedong's foreign policy.

Steve KILLELEA

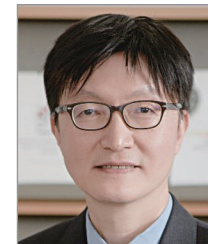
Founder & Executive Chairman, Institute for Economics and Peace, Australia

Steve KILLELEA A.M is a global philanthropist focused on peace and sustainable development, with a long, successful career in high technology and international business development.

More than 20 years ago, he established The Charitable Foundation, now one of the largest private overseas aid organizations based in Australia providing life-changing programs to some of the poorest communities in the world including, emergency and famine relief, environment rehabilitation, and rehabilitating former child soldiers.

Steve's deep commitment to peace has earned him two Nobel Peace Prize nominations. He is the founder of the independent think tank the Institute for Economics and Peace (IEP) and the Global Peace Index (GPI), the world's leading measure of global peacefulness. IEP is a highly impactful non-profit and non-partisan research institute known for innovative analysis on the relationship between business, peace and economic development, used by many international organizations including the United Nations and the World Bank. Steve serves on the President's Circle for Club de Madrid, the largest forum of former world leaders working to strengthen democracy. He is also trustee and treasurer for Religion for Peace, the world's largest organization working on inter-religious challenges.

As an entrepreneur in the high technology industry, Steve founded and built one of Australia's leading publicly listed IT companies. Integrated Research has a 30-year heritage providing its PROGNOSIS performance monitoring software for business-critical computing and IP telephony environments. Through Steve's direction as CEO and then chairperson, IR has an impressive world-class customer base and its software is used by many of the world's top organizations in more than 50 countries.



KIM Heungchong

President, Korea Institute for International Economic Policy, Republic of Korea

Dr. Heungchong KIM, had served at the Korea Institute for International Economic Policy (KIEP) for nineteen years before he has led the institute as President since June, 2020.

He has been deeply involved in policy-making process of the Korean government in the fields of economic, trade and diplomatic policies. Dr. KIM was among the Advisory Staff to the Deputy Prime Minister/Minister of Finance & Economy of Korea, and had been a key advisor to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade on the Korea-EU FTA during the negotiation process. He also advised the Ministry of Strategy and Finance on G20, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on APEC and Korea's mid to long-term diplomatic strategy, and the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy on ASEM and Brexit. He was a visiting scholar in the UC Berkeley as a Fulbright Scholar and held visiting positions at Ifri(Paris), VUB(Brussels) and Marmara University(Istanbul). He served both Sogang University and Ewha Womans University as Adjunct Professors. He is the President-elect of EUSA-Korea (European Studies Association of Korea) in 2021.

Dr. KIM's expertise includes trade policy, European studies, and regional integration. He has published more than 70 papers and books, and has actively contributed to various newspapers and TV programs in Korea and abroad. Before joining KIEP, Dr. KIM was an Honorary Member of the High Table in Christ Church, Oxford. Dr. KIM read economics at Seoul National University and the University of Oxford.

LEE Yong Shik

President, The Incheon Institute, Republic of Korea

President LEE Yong Shik, a representative local researcher, has exerted efforts to present solutions to the city's problems at various levels. Starting with student movements, he has continued his practical activities in the field of strengthening the community through the expression of civic spirit and improving the quality of life of citizens based on his experiences in democratic movements and civic movements.

After obtaining a Ph.D. (Doctor of Public Administration, Feb. 1992), LEE gained five years of research experience at the Korea Research Institute for Local Administration as a senior researcher in the field of local finance. Since then, he has taken the path of a local researcher as a member of the Incheon Institute's founding member (formerly Incheon 21st Century Research Center, Apr. 1996). The experience of having to carry out research tasks in various fields due to the lack of sufficient early research personnel was an opportunity for him to grow as a comprehensive local researcher.

While living and working in Incheon, LEE witnessed firsthand how the city, which had been a surrounding city of Seoul under the Cold War regime, underwent quantitative growth in a distorted form and thus came to deal with serious urban problems. He experienced firsthand the citizens' survival crisis caused by the division and conflict of the two Koreas, the deformed expansion of the city, and the resulting deep spatial and communal wounds. With a sense of duty to find a solution for this issue and apply it to reality, President LEE, formerly research director and deputy director, now focuses on encouraging researchers on their work as the head of the local research institute.



LEE In-young

Minister of Unification, Republic of Korea

LEE In-young currently serves as Minister of Unification of the Republic of Korea.

In 1987, LEE was the Chairperson of the 20th Student Council of Korea University as well as the inaugural Chairperson of the National Council of Student Representatives, which was South Korea's biggest college students' organization. He started his political career in 1999 at the Millennium Democratic Party (MDP).

LEE was elected to the National Assembly of the Republic of Korea in 2004, 2012, 2016 and 2020, and was elected Member of the Supreme Council of the Democratic Party in 2010 and 2012. He served as the Chairperson of the Special Committee on Inter-Korean Economic Cooperation of the National Assembly in 2018 and the 20th Floor Leader of the Democratic Party in 2019.

In July 2020, LEE was nominated as Minister of Unification in the Moon Jae-in government.

Jean H. LEE

Director, Korea Center, Woodrow Wilson Center, U.S.A.

Ms. Jean H. LEE is a veteran journalist and analyst who serves as Director of the Hyundai Motor-Korea Foundation Center for Korean History and Public Policy at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars in Washington, DC.

As a foreign correspondent, LEE led the Associated Press news agency's coverage of the Korean Peninsula as bureau chief from 2008 to 2013. In 2011, she became the first American reporter granted extensive access on the ground in North Korea, and in January 2012, she opened AP's Pyongyang bureau. As a journalist, LEE made dozens of extended reporting trips to North Korea, visiting farms, factories, schools, military academies and homes in the course of her exclusive coverage across the country.

During LEE's tenure, AP's coverage of Kim Jong Il's 2011 death earned an honorable mention in the deadline reporting category of the 2012 Associated Press Media Editors awards for journalism in the United States and Canada. LEE also won an Online Journalism Award in 2013 for her role in using photography, video and social media in North Korea, and was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in feature reporting in 2013.

She worked as a reporter for the Korea Herald in Seoul, South Korea, before being posted with AP to the news agency's bureaus in Baltimore; Fresno, Calif.; San Francisco; New York; London; Seoul, South Korea, and Pyongyang, North Korea, after covering assignments in Europe, Africa, Latin America, Asia and the United States. She joined the Wilson Center as a Public Policy Fellow in 2015, served as a Global Fellow from 2016 to 2018, and returned as Korea director in April 2018.

LEE is a native of Minneapolis. She has a bachelor's degree in East Asian Studies and English literature from Columbia University, and a master's degree from the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism.



LI Xiangyang

Director, National Institute of International Strategy,
Chinese Academy of Social Studies, China

LI Xiangyang is a senior research fellow and director-general of National Institute of International Strategy (NIIS) in CASS.

He is president of Chinese Society of South Asia, of Chinese Society of Asia-Pacific and deputy president of Chinese Society of World Economics, of Chinese Society of Emerging Economies.

And he is also a member of the International Economic and Financial Advisory Committee of China's Foreign Ministry, of the Expert Committee on International Development Cooperation of China's Ministry of Commerce.

He received BA in Economics from Central University of Finance and Economics, and his MA and Ph.D. in Economics from Graduate School of CASS in 1983, 1988, 1998 respectively.

PARK Namchoon is a South Korea public servant and politician who currently serves as the mayor of Incheon. The seventh popularly-elected mayor of Incheon Metropolitan City has been realizing the vision of building 'Incheon, the city where people want to live; where people build the future together,' step by step. Moreover, focusing on citizens as the administrative center, he will continue the commitment to finding and implementing effective policies that promote the happiness of Incheon's citizens.

He served as a Chief Secretary to the President for Personnel Affairs in 2006 and contributed to creating a creative and energetic government organization. In 2016, he was elected as the 20th member of National Assembly while serving as a Secretary to the Public Administration and Security Committee of the National Assembly, and served for three years in the Democratic Party of Korea.

Before managing state affairs, he graduated from the Department of Public Administration at Korea University School of Law and M.Sc. in International Transport, University of Wales, United Kingdom.



T.C.A. RAGHAVAN

Director General, Indian Council of World Affairs, India

Dr. T.C.A. RAGHAVAN retired from the Indian Foreign Service in December 2015 while Indian High Commissioner to Pakistan (2013–15). He had earlier served as Deputy High Commissioner in Pakistan (2003–2007) and High Commissioner to Singapore from 2009 to 2013.

During his last posting in New Delhi (2007–09) in the Ministry of External Affairs Dr. RAGHAVAN was Joint Secretary dealing with Pakistan, Afghanistan and Iran. He has also served in Kuwait, the United Kingdom, and Bhutan. Posts earlier held in the Ministry of External Affairs include Director of the Office of the External Affairs Minister (2000–2003).

He was awarded a PhD by the Jawaharlal Nehru University in 1992 for his dissertation relating to the economic history of India.

Sardesai, Raghubir Sinh and their quest for India's Past" (2019).

He assumed charge as Director General, Indian Council of World Affairs on 24th July, 2018.

SEONG Kyung Ryung

Chairperson, National Research Council for Economics,
Humanities and Social Sciences, Republic of Korea

SEONG Kyung Ryung is the 7th (current) Chairperson of the National Research Council for Economics, Humanities and Social Sciences (NRC). As the Chairperson, he represents and governs the 26 government think tanks of Korea, which provide expertise and scientific research for policy makers. Since taking office, Chairperson SEONG has renewed the efforts to design and support policy strategies for Korea by bridging the gap between theory and policy. Most notably he contributed to the establishment of the policy framework for “Inclusive Growth” and the “Korean New Deal.” Internationally, Chairperson SEONG Kyung Ryung spearheads NRC think tanks’ efforts to expand their network in support of the “New Southern Policy” and “New Northern Policy” by establishing new cooperative relationships and pushing forth research regarding Korea’s measures against COVID-19 with institutions in Korea and abroad.

Chairperson SEONG’s expertise is in Sociology in which he received a Ph. D. from Stanford University. He also had an extensive career as Professor of Sociology at Hallym University where, until his recent retirement, he taught for more than 30 years and had also served as the Dean for the College of Social Sciences.

Ambassador (ret.) Kathleen STEPHENS is a former American diplomat. She was U.S. Ambassador to the Republic of Korea 2008–2011. Other overseas assignments included postings to China, former Yugoslavia, Portugal, Northern Ireland, where she was U.S. Consul General in Belfast during the negotiations culminating in the 1998 Good Friday Agreement, and India, where she was U.S. Charge ‘d Affaires (2014–2015).

Ambassador STEPHENS also served in a number of policy positions in Washington at the Department of State and the White House. These included acting Under Secretary of State for Public Diplomacy and Public Affairs (2012), Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for East Asian and Pacific Affairs (2005–2007), Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs (2003–2005), and National Security Council Director for European Affairs at the Clinton White House.

STEPHENS was William J. Perry Fellow for Korea at Stanford University 2015–2018. She is a Mansfield Foundation Distinguished Fellow, Pacific Century Institute board chairman, vice-chair of the board of trustees for The Asia Foundation, and the Chair of The Korea Society.

She has been President and CEO of the Korea Economic Institute of America since September 2018, based in Washington, DC.

TANAKA Hitoshi

Chairman, Institute for International Strategy,
Japan Research Institute, Japan

TANAKA Hitoshi is Chairman of the Institute for International Strategy at the Japan Research Institute, Ltd., and a senior fellow at the Japan Center for International Exchange.

Prior to joining JCIE in September 2005, he served for three years as Japan's Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs where he was a top advisor to Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi on a broad range of issues, including relations with North Korea, China, Russia and the United States.

As one of the main intellectual architects of Japan's foreign policy, he has been a key actor in shaping Japan's approach to East Asia.

Before being named Deputy Minister, he held various posts at the Foreign Ministry including Director General of the Asian and Oceanian Affairs Bureau and Economic Affairs Bureau; Consul General in San Francisco; and Deputy Director General of the North American Affairs Bureau.

In 2006–18, he was a visiting professor at the Graduate School of Public Policy, University of Tokyo.

Mr. TANAKA holds a B.A. in law from Kyoto University and B.A./ M.A. in Philosophy, Politics, and Economics (PPE) from Oxford University.

Mirko TITZE

Head of the Centre for Evidence-based Policy Advice,
Halle Institute for Economic Research, Germany

Mr. TITZE acts as the head of Centre for Evidence-based Policy Advice at the Halle Institute for Economic Research – Member of the Leibniz Association.

This Centre was founded in 2014 and represents a platform that combines high quality research and policy advice with teaching. Its overarching objective is to improve the foundation of causal impact analysis of policy intervention in Germany. The IWH-CEP directly addresses shortcomings regarding the current practice of evaluations, particularly in the fields of state aid for firms and regions as well as financial markets interventions.

By bringing together the implementation of methods for causal impact analysis, the provision of full data on funding processes and interventions in financial markets and an intensive knowledge transfer between policy-makers, the scientific community, and the public, the Centre produces credible policy advice that lays the ground for reproducibility, replicability, and generalizability of results.

Mirko TITZE joined the Institute in 2006. He started his career at the Brandenburg University of Technology Cottbus-Senftenberg, where he graduated in 2000. Mr. TITZE received his PhD-degree from the same university in 2004. In 2014 he habilitated at the Martin Luther University Halle-Wittenberg. From 2011 to 2013, he worked as an interim professor at the chair of Regional Policy at the faculty of Spatial Planning at the TU Dortmund University. Mr. TITZE is affiliated at the Martin Luther University Halle-Wittenberg, where he holds teaching classes in bachelor and master programs in economics.

Asle TOJE

Political Scientist / Member, Norwegian Nobel Committee, Norway

Asle TOJE (b. 1974) is a roving Political Scientist. He is the former Research Director at the Norwegian Nobel Institute in Oslo, and a current member of the Norwegian Nobel Committee. After completing his PhD in Cambridge (2006) TOJE has lectured and taught at universities in Europe and beyond. Among his scholarly works are “The European Union as a Small Power” (London, Macmillan, 2010) and “Will China's rise be peaceful? The rise of a great power in theory, history, politics, and the future” (Oxford University Press, 2018). TOJE is a syndicated columnist and a frequently used pundit in the international media.

Asle TOJE is Norwegian. He grew up in Byremo, Norway's ‘deep south’. He has since lived and worked in a number of countries, including Germany, France, Belgium, England, and the United States. He was educated at the the Universities of Oslo and Tromsø and received his PhD from Pembroke College at the University of Cambridge. He speaks English and Norwegian and dabbles in German and Spanish.

While at Cambridge, TOJE worked on three main fields of study: international relations theory, war studies and European studies. He wrote his Ph.D. thesis, titled " American Influence on EU Security Policies, 1998–2004," under the supervision of Geoffrey Edwards. TOJE moved to New York City in 2005 to join the doctoral fellows program at Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs. His academic tutors were Kenneth Waltz and Jack Snyder.

TOJE was the Research Director at the Norwegian Nobel Institute from 2012–2018, when he was selected to be a member of the prestigious five-member Norwegian Nobel Committee, a position he will hold until 2024. TOJE lives in Norway but is a sought-after international speech holder and panelist. He is also a foreign policy analyst and adviser to several government agencies and non-government organizations. He is a columnist in several Norwegian newspapers and frequently contributes commentary in the international media, on foreign policy questions.

TOJE has given lectures at some of the world's leading universities, he has also been enlisted as a speaker at venues ranging from the Nobel Peace Prize Forum, to Valdai Conference, the Raisina Dialogue and the Astana Club.
