Incheon Subway Line No. 2 Opens on July 30

Incheon Subway Line No. 2 opens on July 30 with its first train running at 5:30 a.m. It holds a total of 27 stations with a 29.2km-long route ranging from Oryu Station in Geomdan, Seogu to Unyeon Station in Namdong-gu in addition to one car depot there. Once this Line No.2 starts running with an advanced automatic system, it is connected to a transfer system with Airport Railroad, Gyeongin Subway and Incheon Subway Line No. 1, so that it can have an effect on alleviating a traffic congestion in downtown.

To Make China-Friendly City with Sales Diplomacy

Incheon has reinforced its global position as a "China-friendly city" thanks to its sales diplomacy toward China. In particular, it has paved a new way to China by strengthening its relationship with Chongqing (重慶), Beijing (北京) and Changzhou (常州) cities.

Mayor Yu Jeong-bok visited Chongqing, Beijing and Changzhou in China from May 10 to 14 in order to reinforce its inter-city exchanges on economy and tourism and urge the participation in its first governor's conference of Korea and China. First of all, he met Mayor of Chongqing on May 11 and decide to promote exchanges on tourism and business by matching Incheon's charming islands with Chongqing's inland tourism resources, reinforce a substantial economic trade and activate private exchanges on culture and sports. Furthermore, as the president of the Governors' Association Of Korea, Mayor Yu met President Li Xiaolin (李小林) of the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries and exchanged opinions about the first governor's conference of Korea and China. In particular, he met Mayor Wang Dahu (王大虎) in his visit to Changzhou on May 13 and concluded an "agreement on the exchanges of economy, trade, investment and tourism."


GCF Secretary-General Becomes Honorary Citizen of Incheon
