



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GAEHANG-RO, GETTING READY FOR A RENAISSANCE

'Gaehang-ro,' which used to be called 'Ssarijae Hill,' is the passage that begins from today's Gyeongdong Intersection, passes Aegwan Theater, and continues on to Baedari Maeul. It was the main street of Incheon until the 1970s and 1980s. It also had all the places that attract people, from wedding shops to furniture stores, and theaters, forming a commercial district as vibrant as Myeong-dong in Seoul. However, after Incheon City Hall moved to Guwol-dong in the mid-1980s and major commercial districts shifted to Juan and Bupyeong in the 2000s, it became a street devoid of any floating population. In 2017, 20 people, sharing a common goal, initiated the 'Gaehang-ro Project' to revive the town and began to bring life back to the street. It changed the image of the town, which used to be represented by old and battered shops and the old city center, to the leader of new trends, represented by the newtro sensibility. And now, the whole area of Jung-gu has taken back the golden age under the name, 'Gaehang-ro.'

TRANSFORMATION THROUGH GAEHANG-RO PROJECT

Prior to the 'Gaehang-ro Project,' the premise was designated as a redevelopment area that can be demolished and rebuilt any time. However, the twenty people who came together to resurrect the town thought differently; they wanted to keep the historical values and add new values through the Gaehang-ro Project instead of recklessly tearing down everything and constructing new buildings.

They began to see Gaehang-ro in an objective view and subjective affection to realize their intention. First, by taking the advantage of the area, where roads are narrow enough for pedestrians to move between streets without using crosswalks, they decided to revive both sides of the street. They also kept the historical values and images of the buildings that were built more than a century ago, and attached new values to them. As a result, the project, which seemed rash in the beginning, turned Gaehang-ro into the hub of change in the original city center in just two years. With consecutive successes of Brown Hands, Ssarijae Café, Gaehang Noodles, Itta Space, Ilgwang Jeongu Light House, and Gaehang-ro Chicken, the Gaehang-ro Project became the talk of the town.

'Gaehang-ro Lager' is the local beer of Incheon launched through the Gaehang-ro Project. It is designed to suit young people as well as the older generation and is characterized by the refreshing taste lingering in the mouth. Park Ji-hoon, the president of 'Incheon Beer,' a microbrewery, makes sure the beer tastes good, and the font for the brand was developed based on the calligraphic style of Master Jeon Dong-won, who made wood tablets at Gaehang-ro for 54 years. Also, the Fairy Tale Village's mural artist, Choi Myeong-seon modeled for the promotion of the beer. In many ways, the beer reflects the taste and flavor of Gaehang-ro with local residents. Living in Harmony on Earth



The 'Waste Pandemic' is following the virus pandemic. Consideration of the environment has become essential now. 'There is not another Earth that can replace ours.' Save Earth! Incheon provides reliable support through environment-friendly and resource recycling policies so that the three million citizens of the environmental capital can protect Earth.

'ZERO WASTE'

It takes five seconds to produce a plastic product. We use it for five years on average, but decomposition takes at least five centuries. It takes a second to throw it out but a very long time until it is fully disintegrated. 'Zero Waste.' This is the environment-friendly movement to reduce unnecessary wastes produced in everyday life down to zero.

We should not produce waste from the beginning. According to Korea Zero Waste Movement Network, Korea was ranked first for the volume of plastic bags used per person in a year, which amounted to 420 as of 2015. We should use eco-bags instead of plastic bags, tumblers than paper cups, and flatly say 'No' to plastic spoons and straws and disposable wooden chopsticks. We can also reduce wastes by minimizing packaging. Don't be embarrassed to bring your own container when taking out foods from a restaurant and use the 'refill station' from which you can purchase only the content. Flex your love of Earth by practice a minimal life by reducing consumption.

WASTE TO RESOURCE

'Waste is no longer waste' to the citizens of Incheon, the environmental capital, who take action. Waste is a 'resource' to reuse. According to the Ministry of Environment, the volume of domestic plastic wastes increased by 14.6% nationwide compared to 2019 last year. Time is at stake. We must reduce wastes and turn wastes that we produce unavoidably into useful resources.

Coffee grounds, or coffee wastes, is no exception. Only 2% of coffee beans are used and 98% is thrown out as coffee waste when you extract coffee. With a little effort and care, however, coffee waste can be used as daily necessities and even bio energy fuel.

Incheon is collaborating with borough governments and companies to turn coffee wastes into resources. Borough governments of Jung-gu, Michuhol-gu, Namdong-gu, Bupyeong-gu, and Seo-gu along with Hyundai Steel, Korea Productivity Center, and the Korea Green Foundation. Last year, 55 tons of coffee wastes were collected from 119 cafés in Jung-gu and Michuhol-gu and were turned into a resource. This year, Incheon will continue its efforts to revive 660 tons of coffee wastes a year by increasing the number of participating cafés to 600.

THINGS THAT INCHEON DOES WITH CITIZENS



REMEMBER TO 'EMPTY, WASH, SEPARATE, AND DON'T MIX UP'

Recyclable materials have to be emptied, washed, separated, and not mixed with each other to be actually recyclable. As of 2018, 59.8% of the waste collected in Incheon was converted into resources. Incheon intends to raise the percentage up to 95% by 2025.



UPCYCLING BEYOND RECYCLING

Incheon Upcycle Eco Center offers training that focuses on resource recycling and operates related programs. It also has the Upcycling Exhibition Center and the Sharing Center, where people can rent the items they need at a reasonable cost. incheoneco.or.kr ☎032-212-2929




Best Business Environment, Proven through Investment

Quinne, Falling in Love with the Culture of Sharing in Korea, the Country She Chose to Learn Diversity

Quinne Murakawa ("Quinne") from Hawaii dreamed of visiting as many places as she can and experiencing diversity. To this end, she applied to the State University of New York (SUNY) in Songdo, Incheon based on her brief visit to Korea as a volunteer in 2015 and her parents' support. Quinne is studying fashion and she is in her final semester. She says her life in Korea brought many changes to how she thinks. Let's hear from Quinne, who is challenging and planning new things with the influence of the Korean culture of caring.

GRATITUDE FOR THE CULTURE OF CARING

Quinne says her life in Korea had a huge impact on her in many aspects. "Korea has the culture of 'older sister and older brother' that you can't find anywhere else in the world. Studying alone in Korea without one's parents can be lonely and difficult, but I get a lot of encouragement from senior students and friends that were considerate of me and took care of me. They help me with studying and treat me to meals. I also want to become a senior student who treats junior students well. I want to tell my friends about the Korean culture of sharing and spread the culture." Quinne says the kindness of the Korean people is so unique and that it is a pleasant experience. Recently, she visited Munhaksan Mountain by herself, and she met a lady there who kindly showed her the way to the top. She liked that experience so much. **WORLD'S FIRST URBAN MAGLEV TRAIN WITHIN AN AIRPORT
RIDING THE FUTURE OF INCHEON**

Korea's first urban maglev train is a new breed of transportation. Since the train moves while levitated, 8mm above the track rail, it has no mechanical friction and does not produce carbon dioxide or pollution from the abrasion of wheels and fine dusts in the heart of the city, not to mention the noticeably small noise and vibration. A single train car is 12m long, 2.7m wide, and 3.475m tall, and each train is composed of two cars and is capable of transporting 186 people at a time. It extends up to a 6.1km section, and each one-way trip takes approximately 12 minutes. It can save up to 80% of the operating cost compared with existing LRT and offers ride comfort and excellent transportation capability that it is emerging as a new mode of transportation.

You can see everything about the maglev train that will lead the innovation of future transportation there. The center is open 24 hours and is free of charge. The center exhibits maglev train models, describes operating principles, a diorama of the line, and offers a simulated driving experience.

When you pass the Long-term Parking Station and Administration Complex Station and approach Paradise City Station, you will notice that the window becoming translucent. This is the mist window feature designed to protect privacy. Paradise City Station is connected to Incheon Paradise City Hotel and you can reach the hotel quickly and conveniently using the train. 

ENJOYING CULTURE & ART OF INCHEON IN MY ROOM

Incheon Metropolitan City Museum Online Exhibition (Video, VR)

There are various platforms to enjoy the charms of Incheon online. The third one in the series we are going to introduce is the 'Online Exhibition Platform' operated by Incheon Metropolitan City Museum. You can take a look at the history, culture, and arts of Incheon through the videos and VRs that introduce the artifacts and artworks.



INCHEON METROPOLITAN CITY MUSEUM

Incheon Metropolitan City Museum is Korea's first public museum that opened in April 1946. It was established to exhibit Incheon's local history and cultural heritage. You can take a glance at the history of Incheon from the prehistoric era up to the opening of the port. The museum is full of artifacts and remains produced in Incheon that show the life history of Incheon. The museum holds special exhibitions introducing Incheon on various themes, and visitors can see various aspects of Incheon.



SONGAM ART MUSEUM

Songam Art Museum is a private art museum opened by the late Lee Hoe-rim, an entrepreneur born in Gaeseong in 1989. It moved to Incheon in 1992, and Incheon took over its operation in 2005 by following the founder's will. Songam Art Museum exhibits many works across genres from paintings and calligraphic works to sculptures, crafts, and potteries. Other than exhibits, the museum boasts beautiful scenery that includes the red brick wall building and a garden filled with pine trees.



INCHEON URBAN HISTORY MUSEUM

Incheon Urban History Museum opened in August 2009, and it shows the past, present, and future of Incheon. You can see the various changes that the city has undergone for over 130 years from 1883 when it opened its ports and became Korea's first planned city. The model diagrams showing the geography of Incheon, Incheon Free Economic Zone, downtown Incheon, and Ganghwado and Yeongjongdo Islands, photographs, and artifacts that help visitors understand Incheon better. The museum also runs special exhibitions on interesting themes.



GEOMDAN PREHISTORY MUSEUM

Geomdan Prehistory Museum is the only prehistoric museum in Incheon that opened in November 2008. The artifacts in the museum's collection were unearthed during the urbanization of the northwestern region of Incheon including Geomdan, Woldang, Dongyang, and Buldo District. They are exhibited by periods and sites. You can take a look at the lives and cultures from the Paleolithic Era to the Bronze Age. There is a studio where visitors can touch and experience the Paleolithic tools with replicas on the second floor.



THE MUSEUM OF KOREA EMIGRATION HISTORY

The Museum of Korea Emigration History opened in 2003 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the emigration to Americas and to trace the history of Korean emigrants. The first official emigration took place at Jemulpo Port of Incheon in 1902, and currently approximately seven million Koreans around the world are living overseas. The museum shows when Incheon opened its ports and traces of ancestors who left for various places including Hawaii, Mexico, and Germany and their hard lives.

Beautiful Melody that Heals the Mind

Yekwon Sunwoo Piano Recital

Yekwon Sunwoo, a pianist who is drawing great attention at home and abroad, is holding a concert at Arts Center Incheon on June 5. Yekwon Sunwoo is the first Korean musician to win the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition, and he performed with world-renowned orchestras. He released his first studio album, 'Mozart' under the DECCA label and held a recital tour in seven cities in Korea from December 2020 to January 2021.

Yekwon Sunwoo's piano melody finally reached Incheon. News Brief

This month's city hot news



Pedestrian-Friendly Flowery Road in Cheongna International City

Incheon is constructing a beautiful flowery road in the 4km round-trip section on Cheongna-daero (Simgok Bridge 2 – Gongchon Bridge 3) in Cheongna International City inside Incheon Free Economic Zone (IFEZ).

IFEZ Authority will place 73 flower pots on streetlight poles and plant petunia and others from this month to November to beautify Cheongna-daero and provide spectacles for citizens exhausted by the COVID-19 crisis to come and regain some strength.

When the project is completed, it is expected to become an attraction in the heart of the city where citizens who travel on Cheongna-daero will appreciate and enjoy the beautiful flowers.

Introducing the Best Delivery Restaurants

Food delivery is increasing sharply in the 'Ontact (Online + Contact) Era' due to COVID-19. Meanwhile, the blog and social media operated by Incheon Free Economic Zone Authority (IFEZA) are drawing attention by introducing the best delivery restaurants.

This project intends to produce the latest

content combining traveling and eats at Songdo, Yeongjong, and Cheongna International City and tell those visiting IFEZ at home and abroad through social media channels such as the blog, 'IFEZINE,' Facebook, Instagram, and YouTube about them. IFEZA is translating and posting the contents into foreign languages, including English, Chinese, and Japanese, through native speakers, instead of using translations to deliver information that makes more sense to foreign tourists. It also operates a channel for foreigners on 'Weibo,' the largest social media in China, introducing dishes and attractions that foreigners might prefer.

Opening of Seongnam Extension of Subway Line 7 from 'Seongnam to Bupyeong-gu Office'

The Seongnam extension of the Seoul Metropolitan Rapid Transit Line 7, connecting Bupyeong-gu Office and Seongnam Station, opened on May 22 following a comprehensive trial run. The Seongnam extension of Line 7 is a 4.165km long route that extends from the former terminal station, Bupyeong-gu Office Station (Galsan-dong, Incheon), to Sangok Station and Seongnam Station (Seongnam-dong, Incheon). The opening of this extension connects Incheon Line 1 (Bupyeong-gu Office Station) running north and south and Incheon Line 2 (Seongnam Station) in the form of the letter H, completing the transfer system between Incheon Line 1 and 2. Also, passengers transferring from Incheon Line 2 can quickly and conveniently move to Gangnam in Seoul and other locations through Seongnam Station.

The Seongnam extension is the heavy rail transit operated with eight-car trains, same as

the existing Line 7. The operating interval is six minutes during rush hour and 12 minutes at ordinary times.



Turning Seodo into 'Mudflat Garden'

A comprehensive development project to turn all of Seodo, a small island near downtown Incheon, into a 'mudflat garden,' will be fully promoted. Incheon will be combining the development projects for areas under special circumstances with the 'Fishing Village New Deal 300' to improve the fishing environment and settlement conditions of Seodo Island and also improve various environments using the island's resources. Furthermore, Incheon will promote community projects and intensify public relations using Seodo Dullegil Trail.

Seodo Island belongs to Wonchang-dong, Seogu in terms of administrative classification. It is only about 1.5km away from the inland area of Incheon. Its size is 408,000 m² in total, and more than 40 people in 24 households mainly make their livings on fishing. Over 20 wild plants, including plantain and valerianaceous plant grow aboriginally all over the island. The island also has various ecological resources such as mudflats, reed fields, and pine tree colonies.

Full Implementation of Korea's First 'Smart Traditional Market Precise Map' Service

Incheon developed a precise map database for 58 traditional markets within the jurisdiction for the first time in Korea. It began the service providing map data through internet portal sites, such as Naver and Kakao.

This service allows citizens visiting traditional markets to find information about individual stores in traditional markets more easily and in detail. It will mainly provide services that citizens actually need, such as finding the path to the traditional market, store information (store name, operating hours, and items sold), and sharing on social media.

Plastic Toys Become Valuable Resources

Incheon signed an agreement with the Korea Environment Corporation (K-eco) and the Korea Plastic Single Material Association to improve the system for recycling toys as resources at the Green Hall of K-eco on May 12.

The agreement intends to spread the resource recycling culture by ensuring that more people are aware of how to separately dispose of toys and provide subsidies for separate sorting of toys to set up a stable basis for recycling.

For this, Incheon promotes a pilot project of turning discarded plastic toys into resources until the second half of this year by publicizing the separate disposal of toys in proper ways centering on major emission sources, such as private homes, and collaborating with companies that collect and sort wastes.

WEATHER


Located in the middle of the Korean Peninsula and adjacent to the West Sea, Incheon features both continental and maritime climates. The lowest temperature recorded in Incheon in history was -21.0° C (-5.8°F) and the highest, 38.9°C (102.02°F). The average temperature is 12.1°C (53.78 ° F), which is 0.7°C lower than that of Seoul.

LOCATION

The coordinates of Incheon are roughly 126°37'E and 37°28'N, and this is the very middle of the Korean Peninsula, adjacent to the West Sea, and on the lower Hangang River. Located 28 km from Seoul, the capital of the Republic of Korea, Incheon's latitude is similar to that of San Francisco, Washington D.C., and southern Spain.

TOTAL AREA

Incheon is the largest of the eight metropolitan cities in Korea. The total area of Incheon Metropolitan City is 1,063.27 km², which is larger than Ulsan Metropolitan City (1,061 km²) that formerly had the largest area in Korea. The largest cities in Korea next to Incheon and Ulsan are Daegu, Busan, and Seoul, in respective order.



GEOGRAPHICAL FEATURES

The mountainous terrains of Incheon are composed of low hills under 300 m above sea level excluding around a dozen mountains, including Manisan Mountain (469 m), Geyangsan Mountain (395 m), and Samgaksan Mountain (343 m), and there are no large rivers. Incheon has a ria coast, meaning that it has a long and complex coastline with many islands. There are a total 168 islands in Incheon, and 128 of them are uninhabited.

LIFE AND POPULATION

Incheon Metropolitan City comprises two counties including Ganghwa-gun and Ongjin-gun and eight wards (Jung-gu, Dong-gu, Michuhol-gu, Yeonsu-gu, Namdong-gu, Bupyeong-gu, Gyeong-gu, and Seo-gu). Incheon's population amounts to approximately 3 million, making it the city with the third largest population in Korea next to Seoul and Busan. Currently, 72,235 foreigners live in Incheon.

BICYCLE MANNER INSIDE INCHEON SUBWAY

There are many attractions that you can enjoy on your bicycle. Sometimes you need to take the subway to get there. There are some rules you need to keep when taking your bicycle on the subway. Learn how to use Incheon Subway with your bicycle properly and enjoy the ride.



RIDING WITH BICYCLES

For foldable bicycles, you can carry it in the subway both on Line 1 and 2 any day. However, there are some restrictions for ordinary bicycles. On Incheon Subway Line 1, you can carry your bicycle only on holidays and weekends. Line 2 does not allow bicycles because the space inside the car is narrow.



BICYCLE CAR

Bicycle cars are located on both ends of the train. When you get on the train, you need to fix the front wheel on the proper location. Each bicycle car has four bicycle cradles. Beware that not all trains have bicycle cars. If the train does not have a bicycle car, then you will have to wait for the one that has it.



BICYCLE PATH

Incheon Subway Line 1 has bicycle paths to push your bicycle up on the stairs in every station. You can find it easily by following the signs indicating the path. Place the wheels on the path and push your bicycle up on it.



PRECAUTIONS FOR CARRYING A BICYCLE ON THE SUBWAY

- ① Move your bicycle after everyone gets off.
- ② Do not ride the bicycle inside the subway station or train.
- ③ Take caution so that your bicycle does not fall inside subway.
- ④ When you carry a bicycle in the subway, you are responsible for all damages caused by your negligence.
- ⑤ Not observing the above may lead to refusal of service.



Ginseng


