### Songhak-dong History Walkway, Connecting the Old and New, and Mountains and Seas

On July 1, 1981, Incheon was split from Gyeonggi-do (province) and was promoted into an autonomously governed city. The year of 2021 is the 40th year since Incheon became independent.

Incheon remodeled the old mayor's residence in Songhak-dong in celebration of the 40th Anniversary of Incheon's Independence. The spruced-up residence is renamed as 'Incheon House of Citizens (Incheon Siminaejip)' chosen by citizens and is now open to the public. The house next door also opened the space inside the walls to citizens. Take a walk around Jayu Park and Songhak-dong, places that connect the old and new, as well as the mountains and seas.



# Incheon House of Citizens

## OLD MAYOR'S RESIDENCE, 'INCHEON HOUSE OF CITIZENS', OPEN TO CITIZENS

In the late 1800s, buildings of various styles were constructed at the southern foot of Jayu Park, creating an exotic scenery. Most of them were destroyed during the Korean War and by fire. However, the old mayor's residence survived. Incheon purchased this place, constructed a new building in 1966, and used it as the mayor's residence until 2001. Later, it served as a historical museum until 2020. Incheon turned this place into a space dedicated to citizens. The history and presence of Incheon were captured in the antique hanok (traditional Korean house) with an open lounge.

### Tour of Incheon House of Citizens

- 'Jemulpo Hanok Gallery (main building)' comprises the Historical Book Lounge, Historical Corridor, Digital Gallery, and Special Exhibition Hall.
- 'Historical Observatory (management building)' offers a broad view of Wolmido Island and Incheon Port.
- Cool sea breezes blow in the walkway and plaza of 'Jemulpo Garden (outdoor garden).'

### Announcement on Special Exhibition

- Incheon House of Citizens is holding a special exhibition, 'Welcome to Incheon, the Autonomously Governed City.'
- Jemulpo Club just above holds the special exhibition, 'Story of Incheon Told by Trees' until the end of August of this year.

## OLDEST ZELKOVA IN KOREA HOLDS THE FORT FOR 130 YEARS

When you come down from the hill, the oldest platanus in Korea comes into sight. It is a large tree that takes two or three adults to barely put their arms around it. This tree, 30.5 m tall and 4.7m in circumference at the chest height, is the oldest platanus currently existing in Korea.

The tree was planted in 1884, a year after the port opening. Kang Jin-taek (52), a research scholar at the Korea Forest Research Institute, said, "It is presumed to be Korea's first Platanus imported from America or England shortly after the opening of the port."

## HOUSE NEXT DOOR, RENOVATED AS A COMPLEX CULTURAL SPACE, 'OPEN PORT E-EUM 1977'

Lee Gyeong-seong, the first curator of Incheon Municipal Museum and artist, lived in the house next door. The place was later sold, and a fabulous detached house, designed by Kim Soo-geun, a representative architect of Korea, was constructed in 1977.

The Incheon Housing and City Development Corporation remodeled the building by preserving the original structure and opened the place as a complex cultural space titled 'Open Port eEum 1977.'

# 40 years

### From Autonomously Governed City to Environmental Capital, Incheon's Future is Undoubtedly Brighter

Incheon became independent from Gyeonggi-do in July 1981, signaling the 'Era of Autonomously Governed City.'

The city grew three times in population, five times in the area, and 21 times in gross regional domestic product. Culture and arts, as well as transportation infrastructures, were also expanded, and citizens became prosperous.

Its global status also rose. In 2019, the number of passengers that used Incheon International Airport exceeded 70 million. Songdo, the first international city of Korea, is home to the world's prestigious institutions, including UN-related agencies and international organizations and the State University of New York in Korea.

Over the past 40 years, Incheon achieved both qualitative and quantitative growth. With the seventh council members elected by the people, Incheon is raising the speed of advancement for the future of hope and brilliance once again. Undoubtedly, Incheon's future is brighter.

## EMERGING AS THE LARGEST CITY AMONG METROPOLITAN CITIES

Population equals competitiveness and national power. Incheon's population was only 1.14 million in 1981 when it split and became independent from Gyeonggi-do (province) and became an autonomously governed city. As of 2020, Incheon's population turned 3.01 million, three times that of 1981, contending for the second-largest city in Korea against Busan. Incheon's area was 201km<sup>2</sup> in 1981, but with the incorporation of Ganghwa-gun (county) and Ongjin-gun and establishing the Incheon Free Economic Zone through public waters reclamation, it expanded to 1,065km<sup>2</sup> by 2020, becoming the largest city among the metropolitan cities of Korea.

For the past 40 years, the gross regional domestic product increased from 4.2 trillion won up to 89.5 trillion won and the budget, from 81.6 billion won to 18,936 billion. Also, Incheon developed into a city that connects the world through airways and seaways with its traffic infrastructure, port, and Incheon International Airport. In 2001, the world-class Incheon International Airport opened. Each year, tens of millions of people come to Korea through Incheon and the freightage recorded third place in the world. The opening of Incheon New Port in 2015 and Incheon Port International Passenger Terminal in 2020 made Incheon the gateway to the world.



## INTERNATIONAL CITY THAT WORLD WATCHES

With the increasing scale of the city, Incheon holds international sports events, culture and arts events, and hosts UN organizations. Forty five countries participated in the Asian Games and Asian Para Games held in Incheon in 2014 and competed heatedly to win over 3,000 medals in 36 events. In 2021, Songdo, the first international city of Korea, has become home to prestigious organizations of the world, including the UN and international organizations and the State University of New York in Korea.

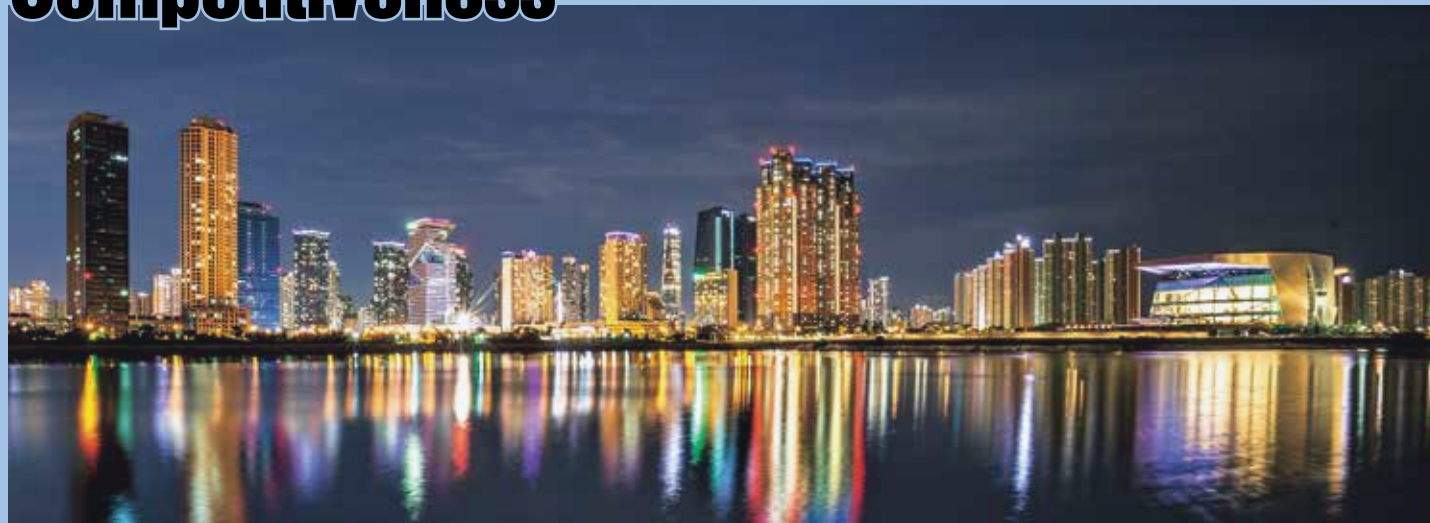

## FUTURE OF K-BIO LIES IN INCHEON

Last year, due to the impact of COVID-19, exports in the domestic bio-health field recorded 15 trillion won (14.1 billion dollars). With such a growth rate, Songdo International City became vital to K-Bio, centered on two major companies, Celltrion and Samsung Biologics. There are currently over 60 bioindustry manufacturers, research institutes, supporting organizations, schools, and bio venture companies in Songdo Zone 4, 5, and 7 (920,000 m<sup>2</sup>). Incheon is putting spurs on the development of the 'Songdo Bio Cluster.' To foster professional human resources in the bio-sector, Incheon attracted the 'bio-process human resources cultivation center' in Songdo and promoted the 'Localization of 30 Bio Raw Materials Project' and the like. Recently, the central government finally selected Songdo to establish 'K-Bio Lab Hub,' the Korean version of LabCentral.

## SPECIAL ECO-CITY, INCHEON – FOR A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

Incheon announced 'Independence as Special Eco-City' for the first time in Korea and started a grand transition into eco-friendly resource circulation policies. The goal is to propose the standards for resource circulation in Korea and global standards. Incheon established the 'Roadmap for Grand Transition to Eco-friendly Resource Circulation Policy' to build a sustainable future with citizens. Incheon is promoting ▲ waste reduction ▲ resource recycling ▲ eco-friendly resource circulation facilities, and ▲ Incheon landfill eco-land. Also, Incheon is innovating ▲ the energy production system for 2050 carbon neutrality and is expanding ▲ urban oasis (green spaces), which serve as a carbon sink.



Environment





One of the most significant pending issues of Incheon is 'Environmental Capital, Incheon.'

Incheon plans to construct a combined environmental and cultural center in each area by 2025, add advanced eco-friendly facilities and beautiful landscape designs like the District Heating Plant at Spittelau, Austria, turning the building into a landmark. It also includes a plan to use metropolitan landfills, which will be put out of use in 2025, as environmental research and startup promotion complexes, ecological parks, etc.

'Six Future Development Sectors of Incheon' refers to the core industry promotion strategy that will be implemented by each region.

Old industrial complexes will go under grand renovation until 2026, and plans such as the future industry-oriented Incheon Free Economic Zone development plan will be implemented.

Apart from the bio-industry that it is currently focused on, Incheon decided to strategically foster areas such as aviation maintenance, repair, and operation (MRO), future mobility, contents industry such as metaverse, and the hydrogen industry. In particular, Mayor Park said, "We will attract a hospital specialized for infectious disease treatment next year and promptly take steps to establish the second Incheon Metropolitan City Medical Center" in relation to health.

Let's keep an eye on the future of Incheon, which will become a better city to live in and the second-largest city of South Korea.

## Future of Incheon in 2030?

### Mayor Park Nam-choon Announces the 2030 Future Continuation Policy, "Aiming at Becoming the Second Largest City of South Korea"

Incheon Mayor Park Nam-choon announced the progress of Incheon over the coming decade on July 1, which marks the third anniversary of his inauguration and the 40th anniversary of Incheon's promotion into an autonomously governed city.

Mayor Park expressed his will, "Incheon will convert its economic structure and achieve sustainable environment by 2030. It will become the second-largest city of South Korea ahead of Busan."

# Will you join this righteous, huge, and unavoidable wave?

‘City Hall Free of Three Things: Disposables, Waste of Resource, and Food Waste’ campaign, which started from Incheon Metropolitan City Hall, is spreading across Incheon. Restaurants and coffee shops around the city hall and colleges, hospitals, and even religious facilities are joining the campaign.

### NO TO DISPOSABLES, “IT’S A NATURAL THING (HABIT), NOW.”

Incheon Metropolitan City Hall has changed! Disposable products are gone, and so are plastic water bottles that were always on conference room tables and paper towels. Tumblers and handkerchiefs are now necessities for the staff.

The ‘Junior Board,’ mainly led by millennials, operates spontaneously and even promotes campaigns with the City Hall staff and citizens. Bringing pots when purchasing foods such as tteokbokki (stir-fried rice cake) and cake or using handkerchiefs instead of wet tissue has become quite natural to them.

### FORGOT YOUR TUMBLER? “BORROW ONE FROM THE SHOP”

‘Green-Green Change’ is taking place around City Hall as well. Lee Seung-yeong, the owner of Russell, a coffee shop located around the rear gate of City Hall, has lent tumblers from March. He has had a great interest in the environment and has already been using biodegradable straws and paper bags.

“There were many times that customers came and just left saying they forgot to bring their tumblers. So, I prepared tumblers for them. About 70% of customers have their coffee in the shop or take them out in tumblers. Disposable wastes have decreased enormously.”

“It’s something that everyone should do for themselves and their loved ones. It’s a natural and unavoidable thing. I hope everyone picks up the habit of doing their part for the environment.”

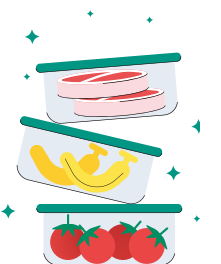

### PRACTICE OF THE ‘ELIMINATE THREE’ CAMPAIGN, SUCH AS “NO DISPOSABLES!” SPREADING THROUGHOUT INCHEON

It was February when Incheon started the ‘City Hall Free of Three Things’ campaign. The goal is to reduce the number of wastes produced at City Hall by 30% by 2025. City Hall workers are visiting stores around City Hall to promote the campaign. Six months have passed since then. The Incheon Metropolitan Office of Education and 63 institutions such as counties and boroughs within Incheon’s jurisdiction joined this Green-Green (Righteous) Campaign. Starting from Incheon Metropolitan City Medical Center, 35 funeral halls in Incheon decided to practice the campaign of eliminating three things. Incheon National University also promised to become a ‘resource cycling eco-friendly campus free of three things.’

## Series 4. I-MOD Bus

If you had inconvenience moving to places without a car, there's a way to enjoy traveling through Yeongjong International City now. Use 'I-MOD Bus' using an app to move between the city center and beach at ease. Ride I-MOD and explore the courses where you can enjoy the summer at Incheon.



## What is 'I-MOD'? (Incheon-Mobility on Demand)

I-MOD is a demand-responsive bus service that allows the passenger to call a vehicle from the bus stop to leave from to go to the bus stop they want regardless of the existing bus route.

### USING I-MOD TO ADD CONVENIENCE TO EVERYDAY LIFE



#### Download App and Join Membership

Before using I-MOD bus, you must install the app. Join membership and sign in to use the app instantly. Set the payment method to a credit card or mobile phone to automatically pay for the fare.



#### Calling a Bus

Choose the bus stop to get on and the one to get off at, and the number of passengers. Press the 'Call' button to place a vehicle. The app tells you when to get on the bus and the estimated time of arrival, and passengers can go to the bus stop according to the weather condition and the arrival time.



#### Getting on and off the Bus

Before getting on the bus, present QR code, the pass issued to the app, to the scanner inside the bus to board and pay at the same time. Up to six people can reserve the vehicle, and passengers with different destinations can share the same bus if the direction is similar.

**Operating Area** Whole area of Yeongjong International City (based on bus stop)

**Fare** Basic Fare – Adults 1,800 won, Adolescents 1,200 won, Children 700 won (After 7km, additional fare will be charged at the rate of 100 won/km)

**Operating Hours** 05:30-23:30 (Call is accepted until 23:00)

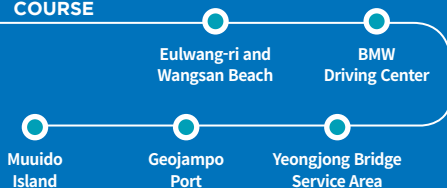

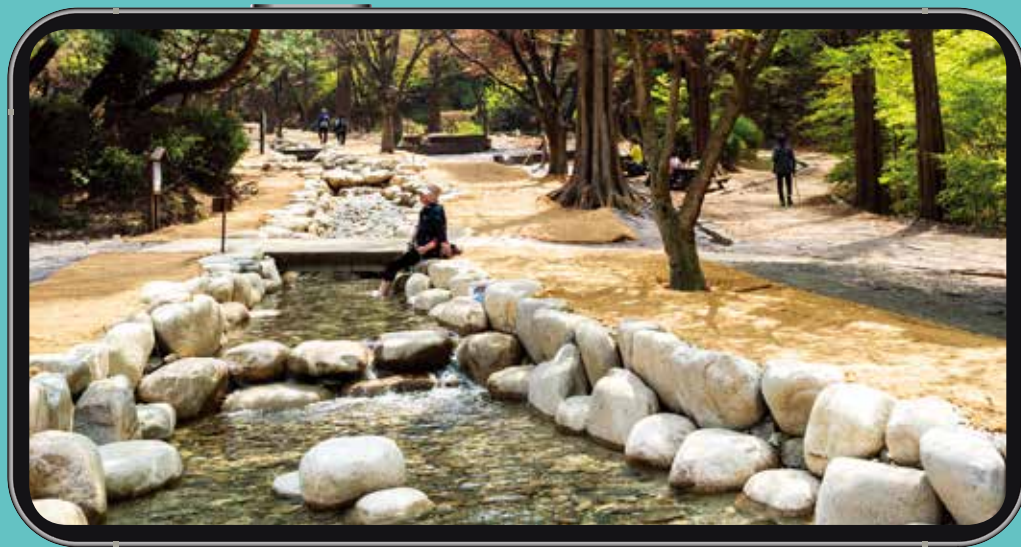

## Gompyo, Born in Incheon in 1952

Few Koreans ever saw a real, live bear when they were young, but they are quite familiar with the bear (gom) depicted in green on the flour sack. When mothers take some white flour from the Gompyo (brand name, literally 'Bear-Brand') flour sack, that was a day on which they made special dishes such as knife-cut noodles, dumplings, and steamed buns. Daehan Flour Mills Corporation, which uses the green bear as its mascot, is a flour company of Incheon established in 1952. It still releases products close to our daily life. Recently, the Gompyo character became hugely popular, and even various collaborated products, such as beer, makgeolli (rice wine), popcorn & nachos, ice cream, cosmetics, and padded jacket, became popular.

Incheon Metropolitan City Museum, the first public museum of Korea, which opened in April 1946, prepared a collaboration exhibition with Daehan Flour Mills Corporation, a company with a long history, titled <Gompyo, Born in Incheon in 1952>. The three-part exhibition will show how Daehan Flour Mills Corporation made progress along with the introduction of wheat flour to Korea and how the wheat flour that we casually enjoyed through changed the dishes and palates of the Korean people.

## Incheon Songdo 'K-Bio Lab Hub' Confirmed. Korean Version of LabCentral

The 'K-Bio Lab Hub' will be established in Songdo, Incheon to foster bio startups that will represent Korea.

On July 9, the Ministry of SMEs and Startups (MSS) chose Songdo, Incheon, to establish the 'K-Bio Lab Hub' to foster bio startups to represent the nation. Songdo is home to Korea's topnotch bio anchor companies such as Samsung Biologics and Celltrion, and hospitals and research institutes, including Songdo Severance Hospital (scheduled to open in 2026), which made it perfect for developing K-Bio Lab Hub as a network for industry, academia, institute, and the hospital is crucial for its operation. Eleven cities nationwide, including Incheon, Gyeonggi, and Daejeon, competed fiercely for this bid. K-Bio Lab Hub is a project about building ▲ an infrastructure required for testing, research, clinical tests, and prototype production, ▲ startup support program, and ▲ an infrastructure designed to comprehensively support the network

industry, academia, institute, and hospital so that bio startups that require advanced technologies for infectious disease diagnosis and new drug development can carry out testing, researches, and clinical tests. It is a twin of 'LabCentral,' the institute in Boston, the USA, supporting bio startups.

State funding alone reaches 250 billion won. It will begin its full operation in 2025.



## Many a Mickle Makes Recycle Possible, PLEX ZERO Season 2

The 'Plex Zero Campaign,' which turns bits of plastics that citizens collected into recycled goods, returned for the second season.

The title, 'Plex Zero,' was coined by combining 'plastic' and 'flex,' which is a trend of showing off one's consumption and adding 'zero' to advocate reducing plastic products that are wasted at enormous levels in everyday life.

Three hundred participants will be recruited through Incheon's resource circulation social media, 'Incheon e-Green FaceBook,' until August 27. Incheon will also collaborate with companies, including CGV, Hansalim, and Shinhan Bank, to operate 17 plastic collection centers so that more citizens can join the campaign.



## Cash Reward for Recyclable Materials, 'Incheon e-Eum Shop'

Incheon is running 'Incheon e-Eum Shop,' which accepts recyclable materials such as plastic and returns cash (Incheon e-Eum Point) to citizens. The shop will open in 22 locations, including resident support centers in each borough and the Pureun Dure Consumer Cooperative in Incheon, successively from July. Take recyclable materials, properly separated, to the shop to receive rewards in 'Incheon e-Eum Point.' When the user joins membership through an app, the reward will be given a month later. All of the recyclable materials collected will be recycled.



## Incheon Commercializes Business Card Made of Dissolvable Eco-friendly Soap

Incheon is picking up speed in the transition of eco-friendly waste policies. This time, Incheon decided to produce and distribute business cards

made of eco-friendly soap. The business card soap that Incheon piloted during the Earth Day event in April received great responses. And Incheon decided to commercialize the item in August. Paper business cards cannot be recycled, and most of them have to be burned. However, the eco-friendly soap business card dissolves in water, eliminating concerns about disposing of them. Anyone can order the business card through Glittering Light Bulb Planning Group (<https://slborg.com/Soaprano>) under the Job Support Association for Severely Disabled People.



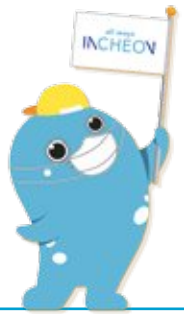
## Voluntary Reporting Period for Pets until September 30

Incheon announced the voluntary reporting period for pets. The period begins on July 19 and ends on September 30. Under the Animal Protection Act, the animal owner must register it to the competent local government. Not registering the animal will be subject to a maximum one million won fine and not reporting changes in the registration, a maximum fine of 500,000 won. The penalty will be exempted during the voluntary reporting period. You can register your pet at the gun (county) and gu (borough) offices or veterinary hospitals.

## Guide to COVID-19 Screening Centers

If you have any suspected symptoms, consult a competent public health center, 1339 Call Center, or Michuhol Call Center (☎032-120), and visit a screening center for testing. Even when you do not have any suspected symptoms, if your family member or a person who lives in the same place as you has any suspected symptom, or if you visited an institute or place where a confirmed case was found, it is recommended that you take the test. Incheon operates ten temporary screening centers in addition to public health centers in ten counties and districts, as well as hospitals. When visiting, use your car if possible, and always wear a mask. Temporary screening centers can be increased or reduced depending on the circumstance.

## New Social Distancing Guidelines

Incheon enforces the administrative order that prohibits drinking and eating in outside spaces and parks from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. of the next day from July 8. Violations are punishable by a fine under the 'Infectious Disease Control and Prevention Act.' Also, those who have been vaccinated must wear masks indoors and outdoors again. Public facilities and beaches are closed temporarily due to the COVID-19 situation (new confirmed cases). With the implementation of the level 4 distancing scheme, you are recommended to observe quarantine guidelines thoroughly and return home immediately after work and stay home where you are safe.

# YOU SAVE ON ELECTRICITY BILLS IN THE SUMMER

Many people are shocked by the electricity bill they receive after using air-conditioners and fans consistently during the hot summer weather. Saving on the electricity bill at home is relatively simple than you may think. Let's find out through keywords about how to dodge the heatwave and save on electricity bills.

## 1. TOGETHER

**Use air-conditioner with fan**

One air-conditioner uses the same energy as 30 fans would. Raising the temperature setting on the air-conditioner by 2~3°C and using a fan with it save 10-14% of electricity. Since the fan spreads the cold air from the air-conditioner, using two appliances together can lower the indoor temperature inside more quickly as well.

## 2. STOP

**Avoid using home appliances simultaneously**

If you want to avoid huge electricity bills, avoid using home appliances at the same time. If you use a microwave oven or a vacuum cleaner while running the air-conditioner, it would be like running two air-conditioners together in terms of the amount of energy consumed. We especially recommend you not to use home appliances that instantly consumes a lot of electricity, such as electric irons, microwave ovens, electric rice cookers, and vacuum cleaners, while running the air-conditioner.

## 3. CATCH

**Reducing standby power with surge protectors**

Standby power is electricity used to keep home appliances in a ready state. To reduce standby power, remove power cords from the outlet if the appliance is not used or use surge protectors with individual power switches. Switching off the surge protector is like removing the plug as it shuts down the standby power.

## 4. CYCLE

**Circulate cold air inside the refrigerator**

Properly circulating the cold air is essential for a refrigerator, because it consumes more power if the cold air is not distributed well inside. To spread the cold air well, don't fill up the refrigerator but up to 60%. Stacking 10% more items inside the refrigerator consumes 3.6% more electricity. Keep this in mind.

## 5. ONCE

**Do laundry all at once**

The electricity consumed by a laundry machine is much more influenced by the volume of laundry than how many times you use the wash machine. In other words, gathering and doing the laundry all at once to reduce the use of the washing machine can effectively save on the electricity bills. Also, drying consumes greater electricity than washing. Use a drying machine or function only when the laundry does not dry well, such as on humid or rainy days.

## TIP!

## WHAT IS PROGRESSIVE STAGE SYSTEM?

**What is the progressive rate system?**

South Korea enforces the 'progressive rate system,' which applies different rates in each stage depending on the volume of electricity used. This system was established in the 1970s to encourage people to save electricity.

**How was it reformed?**

The progressive stage system was reformed in 2019 mainly to lessen the burden on electricity bills due to the use of air conditioners in the summer and to eliminate uncertainties to the system.

(Before Reformation) Stage 1: 200kWh or less,  
Stage 2: 201~400kWh, Stage 3: 400kWh or more  
(After Reformation) Stage 1: 300kWh or less,  
Stage 2: 301~450kWh, Stage 3: 450kWh or more

**How to Cope with the Progressive Rate System**

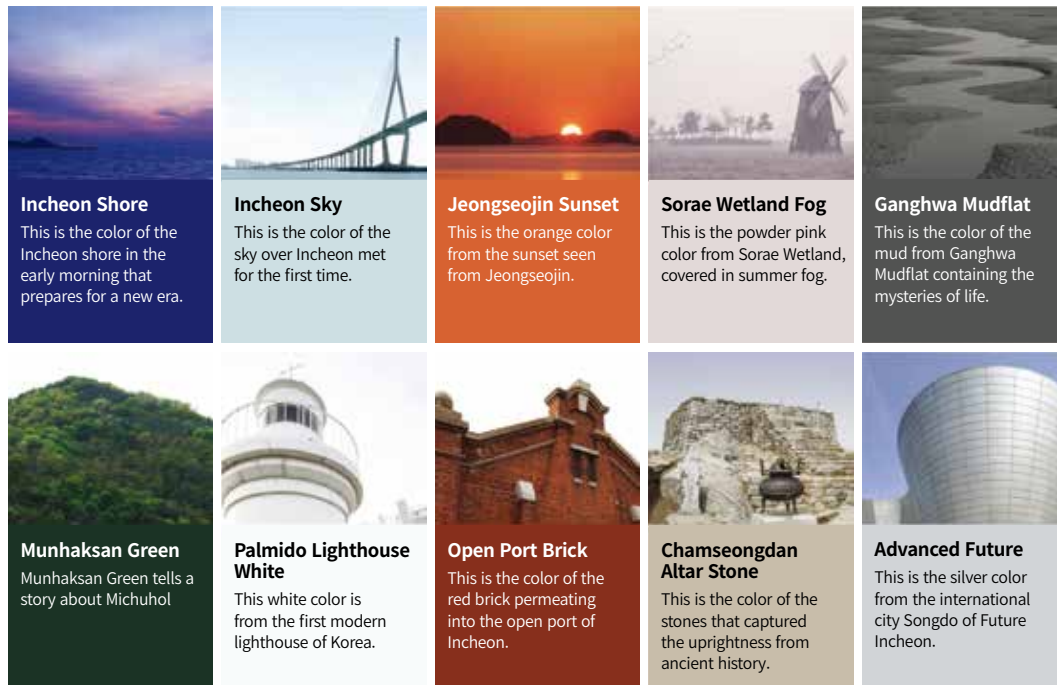

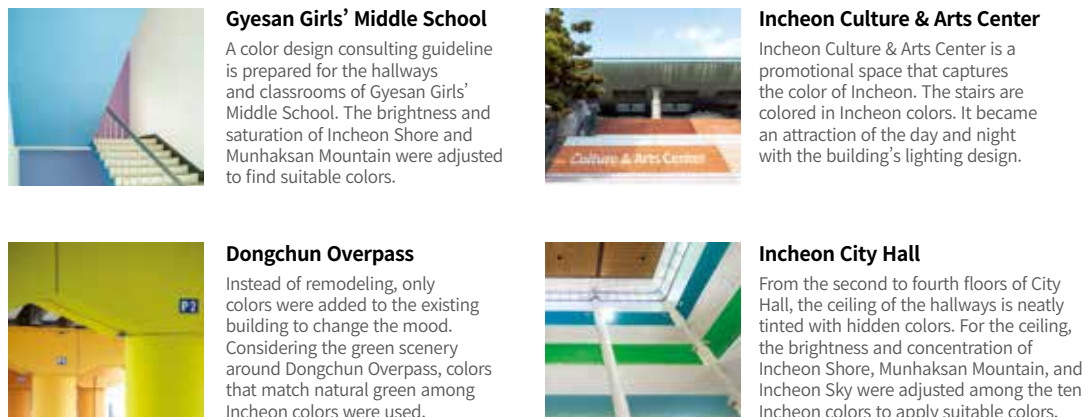

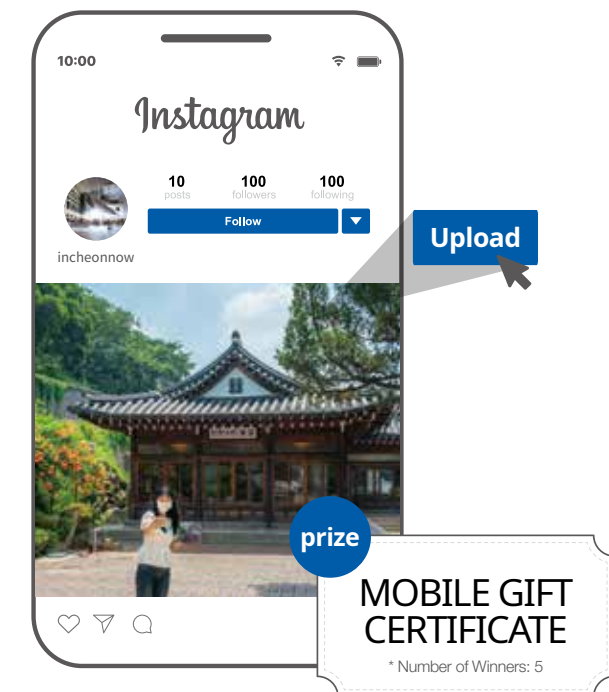
