Paris Baguette Garden Terrace Café, Coffee at Works



It is often visited by passengers who have completed boarding procedures before departure.





Prosper with Art

High-quality artworks beautifully decorate Incheon International Airport as if it is a giant art exhibition. Instead of being a functional space to come and leave, the airport has become a huge artwork, a space for everyone to feel and enjoy.



Hello

'Hello,' located in the middle of the third floor of the second passenger terminal, is the work of artist Kang Hee-ra, which embodies Hangeul vowels and consonants, respectively. The kinetic mobile of the 3D image changes color by producing a gradient. It presents the unique, beautiful image of Hangeul with added artistic values to match the international airport.

Dreaming Space

It is a miniature planet. The names of cities worldwide are engraved inside the sphere-shaped artwork, allowing viewers to experience a virtual tour. It is in front of Gates 239/240, 2F, Terminal 2.



Great Mobile

A large blue mobile penetrates the space from the first floor to the ceiling of the second passenger terminal. It is 'The Great Mobile,' an installation work by the French artist Xavier Veilhan. A large mobile suspended in the air moves naturally with the air flow. For some, it acts as a guide.

Besides storing, the art storage holds exhibitions and auctions and even distributes artworks. For such activities, there will be expected to be new and increasing demands from people who wish to enjoy culture and arts at Incheon International Airport. It is scheduled for launch in 2026.

Tech nology

Incheon International Airport is full of a little consideration to make it more convenient for everyone. Such consideration can be evidenced by 'technology.' Information robots that provide information in the airport and self-check-in services complete the 'smart airport.'



Air Star

'Air Star,' an autonomous driving robot that moves around the airport and helps visitors. It can communicate with visitors through voice recognition software. It guides visitors through the places and provides various information. In addition, technologies such as the self-driving train 'Air Ride' to help with transportation and 'Air Porter' to deliver luggage are available throughout the airport.



PR Observation Deck

The PR Observation Deck presents another cutting-edge technology, a VR Experience Zone. The facility is temporarily suspended due to COVID-19, but it is expected to resume soon with the pandemic subsiding. Dustin Schwindt ("Dustin," 47), who currently lives in Songdo International City, is a professor at the University of Utah Asia Campus, teaching Film & Media Arts. He lectures students on photography and media-related classes and takes pictures of Incheon in his spare time.

Seeing the World through the Camera Lens

Dustin has a long-standing relationship with photography. He grew up around shooting equipment because his father took photographs as a hobby. Still, he was not interested in photography at the time. Later he was struck by an overwhelming feeling from taking pictures of beautiful scenery, while traveling in Canada in high school. However, he was disappointed with the results when he returned to the United States and developed his photos.

His interest in photography returned when he came to Korea for military service. He said, "I hung pictures I took from Dongducheon and Camp Casey on the wall, and I remember people liking it." After that, he studied photography while working in Kansas and returned to

San Diego to start taking pictures in earnest. He became immersed in photography while taking photography-related courses at the University of Palomar and taking photographs for the school newspaper. He continued taking pictures while working as an educator in Taiwan and Turkey.

He also has a long-standing relationship with Incheon. When he was dispatched to Korea while serving in the military, he took a trip on the subway and got off somewhere blindly. It was Incheon. Over time, after completing his master's course at the University of Utah, he became a film and media arts professor at the University of Utah Asia Campus in Incheon. He took a plane bound for Incheon and thought his relationship with Incheon was interesting.



Darkroom, a Special Space to Face the Results


When Dustin was living in the United States, he was going to set up a darkroom in his bathroom. He had to put it off due to concerns about chemicals and other hazards. When he became a professor at the University of Utah Asia Campus, he suggested installing a darkroom in the school. The darkroom was installed in the summer of 2020 with the dean's support. It is currently used by students and professors of various majors and photography clubs. For Dustin, the darkroom is both a scary and exciting place. There were many concerns about the use of the darkroom at first. Over time, this space has become a place where various cultures meet and for international and Korean students to hang pictures of themselves and interact with each other. Anyone can take pictures, and many students come to this place.

Taking Pictures is Like 'Playing'

Dustin plans to install a camera obscura for Incheon in collaboration with the Department of Urban Ecology. It is a facility that can be seen all over the world, including in San Francisco and England, allowing visitors to see the vivid image of the city. "If there is a camera obscura in Central Park, you can see boats, passers-by, etc., upside down. It is like the inside of a camera, and you will be able to learn the principles of photography." We could feel his affection for photography and Incheon while seeing him describing it.

For Dustin, the art of photography is like 'playing.' He said, "To those who take pictures, some people who think of photography commercially say that they should become photographers. But you can take pictures simply because you like doing it." He emphasized, "The most important thing about art is to have fun when you do it." Throughout the interview, we could feel Dustin's deep passion and concerns for photography.

Currently, Dustin is sorting over 70,000 photos into a few hundred by scanning the photos he has personally kept for a long time and uploading them to the website. He told us his plan to travel and take pictures using new techniques when the sorting is done.

Nairobi Coffee Bistro

Incheon is a global city. In particular, many foreigners live in IFEZ (Songdo, Yeongjong, Cheongna). The current foreigner population of IFEZ is approximately 6,492. There is a café famous among these foreigners. Nairobi Coffee Bistro, located in Songdo International City, is always filled with the chatters of regular customers from all over the globe.

PLACE TO MEET

It's a weekday afternoon, and Nairobi Coffee Bistro is already crowded. What is unique about this place is that you can meet people with different eye colors. "We have customers from Chadwick International School, IGC faculty, and Boeing pilots in Yeongjong. More than 30% of regulars are foreigners." The café's owner, Lee Shin-dong, greeted us with a gentle smile unique to him.

We could feel the presence of Nairobi in various places at official events of the international schools and global companies in Incheon. Graduation parties and one-day drip coffee classes are often held here. Nairobi Coffee Bistro has become a 'place of meeting' well-known among foreigners after the owner has built bonds with regulars. Souvenirs from friends around the world are increasing all across the café.



BEGINNING OF NAIROBI

When he was young, he was engaged in equipment sales and café consulting. One day, he found a booth of 'Nairobi' in an exhibition place. He was captivated by the thought of introducing Nairobi coffee, supplied to the British royal family, to Korea. After that, he started running a coffee shop in downtown Seoul.

Nairobi Coffee Bistro, located in Songdo International City, is the place that Lee carefully built from large parts to small details. The thick hardwood table that creates a comfortable and elegant atmosphere was made from 2,000-year-old solid wood airlifted here. Every corner of the place, including even the hand-stained accessories found throughout the café, has been cared for. It has more than 20 different kinds of coffee beans and has one of three large grinders in South Korea.

**Confidence of Café,
Sam's Drip**

Lee is a master of coffee who has studied coffee for a long time. He brews custom coffee to suit customers' tastes just like a professional tailor makes a suit that perfectly fits the customer's body. The coffee is called 'Sam's Drip' after his English name. His hand drip coffee makes even the layperson of coffee not forget the taste and return.

According to Lee, the best time to enjoy coffee is 10 minutes after the coffee is brewed completely. This is because the temperature at which the taste buds can feel the taste most accurately is 50-55°C. "Some people do not like coffee that is not hot. But in the end, when they taste it, they all show that they are satisfied." When you taste Sam's Drip, which he recommends, you will enter a new world of coffee.

A Foreigner's Guide to Living in Incheon

Korea

South Korea has many charms, such as diverse cultures, systematic education, rich history, and a convenient living environment. More and more foreigners are coming to South Korea, fascinated by these charms. In this issue, 'Paris Irizarry', an international student at George Mason University Korea, will guide you through his know-how of living in Incheon.

Talk. 1

Relationship with Korea that Started from K-pop

My name is Paris Irizarry, and I am a student at George Mason University with a double major in Global Affairs and Foreign Languages with a concentration in Korean. I was born and raised in the United States in Waterbury, Connecticut, and I started learning Korean in high school. My interest in Korea originally began from listening to K-pop. I can fully remember that the first music video I watched was SHINee's Ring Ding Dong. They were the first group that made me look more into other artists from SM entertainment. Eventually, I started teaching myself *Hangeul* every day after school, and from there, I knew I wanted to eventually go to Korea in my lifetime. When I finally became a senior in high school, a friend told me about George Mason University, located in Fairfax, Virginia, and how they have a campus in Songdo.

Talk. 2

George Mason University Korea, A Place of Learning

In my first two years at George Mason, I took Korean language courses to help me learn the language more. Even though my initial interest in Korean was K-pop, learning more about Korea's history and language deepened my interest in the culture. By the end of my second year, a friend of mine at George Mason suggested that we apply to George Mason University Korea (Mason Korea) so that we could explore the campus, Songdo, and Seoul. I remember my first week in Korea, which was in 2019, was a big culture shock. Yet, I still felt comfortable being on campus. To avoid being uncomfortable with the language barrier outside of campus, my first method was to push myself to order food at restaurants in Korean. As my confidence in speaking Korean outside campus improved, I began to talk freely with the Korean students at Mason Korea. Because I made many Korean friends on campus, they taught me more expressions to use when I'm off-campus. I recommend to foreigners who come to Korea to learn *Hangul* first and some simple phrases. Once in Korea, try visiting nearby cafes, restaurants, or convenience stores to become familiar with the employees.

Talk. 3

The Secret to Improving One's Korean Skills Starts With Confidence

The employees will appreciate your efforts even when you feel that your pronunciation isn't great. The goal here is to find the confidence to speak so that you can use what you studied in your spare time. Since you will be fully immersed in the culture, try to travel as much as possible while using the expressions you learned in a Korean class or by yourself. This will also make it easier to make Korean friends, who will teach you more words outside the materials you cover on your own.

Talk. 4

How to Get Closer to Koreans

I remember using honorifics in Korean with taxi drivers and restaurant employees and they said that my Korean was very good. Besides knowing the language, understanding and implementing Korean mannerisms will gain you the utmost recognition. For example, when I was eating with one of my friend's parents, I made sure to turn away from them when taking a sip of my drink. His dad was so impressed that I knew of their social cues when eating and drinking in Korea. I found that the best way to connect with Korean people is to share a meal with them. If it wasn't for my Korean professors and friends explaining Korean culture and how to integrate yourself into it, I would have never fully understood or appreciated it the way I do today. Making as many Korean friends as possible in Korea can really help foreigners understand the cultural differences and overcome language barriers. I guarantee that you will have priceless experiences with those you surround yourself with as you spend time in Korea.






Incheon Ganghwa Honey

On Ganghwado Island, an island with blessed nature, there are beekeepers who produce high-quality natural honey with love for bees and honey. From the types of Ganghwa honey that can be easily purchased from the website to where to buy them, we will tell you everything about it here.

• HONEY, DEW FROM HEAVEN

Sweet honey is a popular snack. In fact, it was used as medicine rather than food long ago. In ancient Egypt, honey was used to treat wounds. In Eastern medicine, honey was believed to have a detoxifying effect and stops pain. The insight of the ancient people is outstanding. Honey actually helps relieve fatigue and boost immunity. In the past, the Romans called honey 'dew from heaven.' Human affection for honey seems to go back a long time.

• TYPE OF HONEY

According to the type of bee, honey is divided into 'natural honey' and 'honey from beekeeping.' Most of the honey we have is from beekeeping. About 10 kg of honey is harvested from a group of bees. Also, depending on the type of flower, it is further divided into acacia honey, buckwheat honey, chestnut honey, and so on. There are two types of Ganghwa honey sold on the website: acacia honey and multi-floral honey.



Acacia Honey

It refers to honey extracted from acacia flowers around May and accounts for more than 70% of domestic honey production. It has a delicate fragrance and mild taste, making it easy to take.



Multi-floral Honey

It is rare honey produced by bees that visit many flowers from place to place in the mountains and fields. It has a good flavor and contains various nutrients. It is recommended for those who want a strong flavor and sweet taste.

• MADE BY - GANGHWA HONEY

Ganghwa Honey offers special honeys that you could not find easily. They allow consumers to enjoy great nutrients collected from honey more readily and conveniently.



Bee Pollen

Bee pollen refers to pollen collected by bees. It is a collection of pollen matured while bees were collecting pollen. It contains seven times more protein than beef.




Honey Stick

• PRECAUTIONS



The recommended daily intake of honey is 25-30g for adults and 5-10g for children. Take caution as taking an excessive amount of honey may lead to symptoms such as stomach pain.



Various vitamins and amino acids contained in honey are destroyed by heat. It is recommended that you do not heat it to 40°C degrees or higher when you have it.

2022 Gallery Exhibition

'Alley - Memories Left Behind'

Nameplates and plaques collected from the demolished alley at 109, Sungui-dong, Incheon, can be seen again. We search for new ways and remember what has been disappearing while the city changes in the blink of an eye and development increases. 

Incheon Expands Cashless Incheon Bus to 17 Routes

The 'cashless Incheon bus,' which has been piloting two routes in Incheon since January, will be expanded to 17 routes and 228 buses by adding 15 routes.

According to statistics, the rate of passengers paying their city bus fares with cash, which was 3.52% in 2018, is gradually decreasing to 2.60% in 2020 and 2.20% in 2021. Regarding the trend, Incheon implemented a pilot project

to eliminate cash last January and expanded the project from the 20th of this month.

Following the existing two routes for buses 62 and 535, 15 additional routes are for busses 2-1, 6, 24-1, 34, 35, 76, 103-1, 111, 307, 330, Loop 43, 510, 511, 579 and 586. Passengers who do not have a transportation card can use the QR code in the promotional material attached to the bus stop to get a mobile transportation card or purchase a transportation card for 5,000 won available on the bus to instantly use the bus, as in the previous pilot period.

'Stop for the Right Cause, Stop First before Turning Right' Campaign



Incheon conducted a campaign called 'Stop for the Right Cause, Stop First before Turning Right' with attorney Han Mun-cheol. The campaign was planned to form a civic consensus on traffic safety and for the branding of 'Safe City Incheon' following the effectuation of the revised Road Traffic Act from July 12. The video of the 'Stop for the Right Cause' campaign can be viewed on Incheon's official YouTube channel.

Active participation of citizens who stops first before making the right-turn in daily life is expected through the campaign.

IFEZ Promotes Full-scale Installation of Smart Crosswalk

Smart crosswalks will be installed and operated at 17 major intersections in IFEZ in August. A smart crosswalk is an assistive device for traffic safety that uses the latest information and communication technology (ICT) to improve pedestrian safety. IFEZ will install the pedestrian signal light with ground LED, which more obviously indicates when to cross and when not to at the crosswalk

and a voice guidance system for pedestrian signals that prevent accidents by providing voice guidance for each situation appropriate for the position of pedestrians. IFEZ will also operate a red remaining time indicator showing the remaining time in numbers and figures at the traffic light and an automatic pedestrian signal extension system that extends the crossing time by five to ten seconds if the pedestrian is in the middle of the crosswalk.

Incheon Support Center for Childcare Expands Beneficiaries of Free Service



To overcome the shallow birth rate, Incheon will expand the scope of people eligible for free use of the ‘Incheon Support Center for Childcare’ to women who conceived their second child and families on parental leave. ‘Incheon Support Center for Childcare’ is a close-to-life home child care support facility that can be used with children (under five years of age). It is open from Tuesday to Saturday from 10 a.m. to

6 p.m. For a fee of 1,000 won (2,000 won to apply for a program), visitors can have a play experience with the child and parenting coaching services from experts.

Public Late-night Pharmacies Expanding to 16 Locations



Incheon operates public late-night pharmacies (365 days, 10 p.m. to 1 a.m.) that provide medical services to those who urgently need medicines during late nights and holidays. The public late-night pharmacies started in three locations in 2019 and are currently operating in 13 locations in 8 districts as of 2022. Incheon will call for more pharmacies in three districts, including Geomdan, Cheongna,

and Yeonsu, until August to operate 16 pharmacies. Pharmacy operators can apply for participation through the local pharmacy association.
