

A View with Island, Sea, and Sun Geojampo Quay

Geojampo Quay is a famous spot where you can see the sunset and sunrise over the sea. Particularly in winter, many people visit the quay to see the sunrise and discover the beauty of 'Maedorang,' an uninhabited island that can only be seen at the Geojampo Quay. Maedorang

Island is called 'Shark Island' because the island's shape resembles a shark's fin. The sun rising behind the island creates a spectacular scene. During the year-end and New Year's holidays, people embrace the new year with a new attitude here.

Closer to the Sky Gyeyangsan Mountain

Gyeyangsan is the guardian mountain of Incheon and the symbol of Gyeyang-gu. It is the mountain favored by many hikers. As such, the mountain is known for many things, but it is most known for the outstanding view at dawn when the sun rises at the end of the year. Gyeyangsan Mountain is not easy to hike as it is about 395m above sea level. However, you will reach the top in no time, where you can see the panoramic view of Incheon when you continue to walk while appreciating the surrounding scenery. Since it is colder in the mountain than the ground, it is recommended that you dress warmly when you hike.

The Bell Announcing a New Tomorrow
Jeongseojin

Jeongseojin, "the ferry at the western end of the earth," is a representative tourist attraction in Seo-gu frequented by many visitors from outside. The charm of Jeongseojin appears, especially when the sun sets. You can see Yeongjong Bridge and the beautiful sunset from the Ara Tower Observatory, a famous sunset spot. Finding the sun falling into the Sunset Bell is also attractive. In addition, the trail, pinwheel, and sunset wall make Jeongseojin's sunset even more beautiful. The roads around Jeongseojin are perfect for driving.


Appreciating Sunset While Walking
Solchan Park

When the sun sets, various colors, including yellow, orange, indigo, and sky blue, form a gradation across the sky. You can often find seagulls flying freely. There are cafes and convenience stores in the park to enjoy food and drinks while cooling off.

A Place Where Starlight Falls
Subong Park

Subong Park, located on Subongsan Mountain, Michuhol-gu, is famous for its night view. Here, you can see downtown Incheon at a glance, and it has recently become a hot place thanks to the Starlight Festival held in the park. The starlight created by various lighting reveals its presence across the park. To see the famous sculptures of the moon, rabbit, horse, etc., and the Memorial Tower, you have to walk for about 15 minutes from the entrance to the top. Colorful lights connected along the paths with stories, such as Starlight Walk and Memory Garden, will entertain your eyes.

Central Park



Cool Run on Skates Roll Cat





Interview

Reazul Ahsan & Farhana Haq Family

Bangladeshi Australian couple Reazul Ahsan (45, "Reazul") and Farhana Haq (41, "Farhana") moved to Songdo three years ago. This global family came to Incheon, the city they were not familiar with, through a year-long plan. We wonder how they have lived in Incheon. We met Reazul and Farhana and talked about how they settled down in Incheon and the strength of family that makes them endure the cold winter.



'Global Family' Getting Stronger

Before coming to Korea, Reazul and Farhana had been traveled many countries for their jobs and travel. Reazul has taught and researched at prestigious universities in various countries. His wife, Farhana, worked for more than eight years in social work and in the human resources department of a company in Australia. She worked as a producer for state-run broadcasting company in Hungary and worked at the news agency while living in England, building up various talents. Farhana, currently concentrating on raising the children, is leading a busy life with various social activities and she also served as a Vice President of Class Parents group at the Canadian International School in Songdo, where her children attend.

When they first came to Korea, they originally planned to stay for about a year and return. However, the couple is satisfied with their life in Incheon and planning to stay in Incheon for a few more years. Currently, Reazul is a professor at the University of Utah Asia Campus, where he oversees the process of building the Smart City Laboratory Platform. He said, "When I was teaching smart cities in other countries, I couldn't actually show them, but in Incheon, I feel worth because I can go out to the site and explain them directly."

Incheon, a City like Home

The most satisfying thing about Songdo, a global city, is 'safety' and 'neighbors,' who are always friendly. Most of all, because the couple's children, Ayesha and Ibrahim, spent their childhood in Incheon, it became their hometown. "I have lived in many countries, traveling the world, and I can say that Songdo is a very family-friendly city. These days, I spend time with my children in the park, and that makes me happy."

Last summer, they planned to send the children to Australia to attend school for a year. However, Ayesha and Ibrahim, who went to Australia, strongly insisted on going back to school in Korea. "They spent about a month in a school in Australia, and they cried because they missed their Korean friends and teachers. Eventually, we had to bring our children back to Incheon." For their children are popular among friends, they hang out with friends and their families every weekend. The Reazul and Farhana family is busy every week.

Their family is adored by the local and school communities, earning Songdo the moniker "liked place to be."



Family, Reassuring the Support for Each Other

COVID-19 broke out shortly after they came to Incheon for the first time. The past two years have been a difficult time for everyone. However, Reazul and Farhana family could spend more time with the families because of this. Sometimes the children comforted and supported the father who was having a hard time, and Reazul also strongly supported the children and Farhana. They say they feel the energy of becoming one with each other when they support each other. "After coming to Korea, I became closer to my family and felt that they are the source of my strength."

In particular, Reazul really looked out for Farhana, saying that the family would be in bad shape without her. It was cold when we had the interview. We could feel his love toward the family in the way he took care of his children and wife. "We have not decided any specific plans, but we are going to have new experiences in various countries." To Reazul's words, Farhana also added, "Wherever Reazul goes, I would love it." We support the life of the Reazul and Farhana family in Incheon who always support each other.

After studying abroad in Australia and working as a chef in hotels and restaurants, the owner, chef Sohn Jae-min settled down in Incheon and opened a restaurant in Nonhyeon-dong. It offers a variety of dishes, such as homemade burgers, pasta, tap beer (beer poured by 10ml), and other dishes that you can enjoy according to your taste.

+ Blue Ribbon Survey

It is a restaurant guidebook in Korea that was first published in 2005. It is considered the most trusted restaurant guidebook in Korea and is evaluated through a "survey method" that collects multiple opinions based on objective data. Melting Room was listed in the guidebook four times in a row from 2019 to 2022.

Chef's Confidence felt in the food

The characteristic of Melting Room is that the chefs prepare dishes with fresh ingredients from the local market. Ingredients are fresh, and the chef's sincerity can be felt throughout each dish. Even for bacon, most places use the 'injection method,' which is to make bacon by injecting the salt solution, but in Melting Room, the meat is directly trimmed, salted, and smoked. This elaborate cooking process makes the food taste special. It went viral in no time and was listed in the Blue Ribbon Survey, called the Korean version of Michelin, for four consecutive years.



Parisian Burger

Signature menu recommended by the Chef

Owner chef Sohn Jae-min picked 'Fresh Noodle Carbonara' and 'Pulled Pork Burger' as the signature menus. 'Fresh Noodle Carbonara' is a special delicacy that lets you enjoy the taste and fun by having fresh noodles with good texture, bacon, and sous-vide poached eggs together. The pulled pork burger has many loyal customers. After roasting, it is served with the signature barbecue sauce to give a savory taste. In addition, the 'Parisian Burger,' famous among customers of all ages, is prepared with a generous amount of mushrooms with a smoky flavor.

A Place to Share Delightful Taste with Precious People

Many customers visit Melting Room with families or lovers. The sound of chatter and smiles fill each table. On the wall is a handwritten "Letter of Appreciation" handwritten by a child customer. It has a message saying, 'Thank you for making a delicious hamburger.' Melting Room became a cozy place for customers by making and sharing many memories like this.

Q. What are the things that are unique to 'Melting Room' and you are proud of?

Our chefs prepare food sincerely and with great effort. We ensure our customers have as healthy food as possible by using fresh ingredients purchased directly from the local market. We are involved in each process step, so it takes a lot of time to prepare the ingredients.

Q. What is the most popular menu among foreign customers?

Foreign customers' favorite is the 'Parisian Burger.' It's a mushroom burger with sautéed button mushrooms, king oyster mushrooms, onions, 150g patty, double sweet cheese, tomatoes, homemade pickles, and romaine. It is recommended to enjoy pulled pork cheese fries and tap beer together with the burger.

Q. If you could describe this space in one word, how would you do it?

I want it to be a 'local restaurant that people want to come with someone they love.' We hope that guests who visit Melting Room will make good memories in a pleasant atmosphere. We are constantly working hard so our customers can have a valuable time.

Q. Please say something to the restaurant customers and readers of <Incheon Now>.

Thanks to local customers who have always given us generous support, we could overcome the COVID-19 crisis. No need to say more. We will repay you with more delicious dishes. I hope you will make many good memories in beautiful Incheon.

My Language Journey as a Korean Studies Student

A Sprout

My introduction to the Korean language is probably like any other international student's first look at Korean culture: through Korean music and or Korean dramas and films. In middle school, several friends of mine loved all the major K-pop groups back in 2013, but I didn't develop my own interest in these topics until the next year when I entered high school. However, my interest didn't just end at K-pop and K-dramas. It rather fueled my desire to learn more about the country these products originate from, specifically what kind of culture Korea possesses.



A Budding Dream

When I entered George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia, back in 2018, a Korean language major didn't even exist. I took a beginner's Korean language class as an elective. At the time, Korean content wasn't globally appreciated as it is now. So, the amount of content with English subtitles available was vastly smaller. International fans who didn't understand Korean relied on English translations from fellow fans, but the amount of accessible fan-made translations depended on how popular the content was among international fans. Due to this, I taught myself to recognize the names of my favorite topics in Korean to find more content. Thus, when my Korean language professor excitedly announced the establishment of a Korean Studies major, I was sold at the opportunity to focus on the only subject I had any real passion for at the time. Before even learning Korean, my professor explained the story of how Hangul was created and the significance it represents to Korea, Korean culture, and Korean people. I was pleasantly surprised at how easy it was to learn Hangul. After just a few lessons, I could read Korean, although I couldn't understand any of the words. There, my Korean language journey began.

The Growing Pains

Learning a new language from scratch comes with its challenges. For one, everything is mainly taught through a textbook. Consequently, my reading and writing skills advanced more quickly than my listening and speaking skills. Learning a new language without any real-life opportunity to utilize those new skills was the real difficulty I had to overcome. My professors did create opportunities to use Korean, but those opportunities were limited to the classroom, and they usually followed a script that wasn't always accurate to how Korean is actually used in everyday life. Additionally, retaining those lessons requires a significant amount of self-study time, but self-discipline has never been my strong suit, and the COVID-19 quarantine definitely did not spark any intense motivation to study Korean. Due to this, I felt myself gradually losing focus on my major, which led to some academic troubles in a few of my classes. Thus, I had to delay my college graduation by a year, but this setback gave way to a new opportunity, studying abroad in Korea and, in turn, a new study method.

Reaching for the Sun

After living in Korea for four months, I discovered several realizations about how I learned Korean. Specifically, I noticed that my Korean skills were not at the level they should be for someone with four years of Korean language learning under her belt. However, actually being in an area where everyone speaks Korean, besides on campus, has significantly improved these rusty skills of mine. I'm able to consistently practice my Korean in real-life situations, such as simply ordering food, although sometimes the employees will switch to English if they see me struggle. Yet these experiences, including the embarrassing ones, are vital to improving my Korean skills because it's a real-life situation rather than a simulated one in a textbook or in class. Thus, I always push myself to use Korean, even if what I say isn't a complete sentence or doesn't make grammatical sense. While English is easier to speak when I go off-campus, I need to endure all the challenges that come with using Korean in the real world if I truly want to improve my Korean language skills for the better.


KOREAN REAL ESTATE SYSTEM AT A GLANCE

Each country has a different real estate system and living environment. Before learning about Incheon's settlement environment, you must first understand real estate in Korea. We explained unfamiliar terms and related systems, such as types of buildings, how to purchase a house, and renting.

1. Type of Housing

Apartment	A five-story or higher collective residence. There are convenience facilities such as a shopping mall and a parking lot.
Studio Apartment	A combination of office and apartment. It comes with a parking lot. ※ It is a building for residence and office use, divided into one-room, two-room, three-room, hotel-style one-room, and apartment-style one-room, depending on the number and type of rooms.
Detached House	A house built alone on private land (a house without partition registration, in other words, owned by a single person)
Row House / Multiplex Housing	A western-style mansion or low-rise building. The space is smaller than the apartment complex.

2. When Buying a House

Consulting a licensed real estate agent

- You must sign a contract after checking the credit and experience of the authorized real estate agent.

Preparing a property transaction contract based on a brokerage contract

- All procedures, such as ownership transfer registration, are carried out by the licensed real estate agency.

Before contract

- You must check the certified copy of the register. (You will need the foreigner registration card and passport when visiting the registry office in the jurisdiction)

- Applicable laws vary for foreigners depending on the 'Status of Residence' and the 'Purpose of Purchasing Real Estate.'
- You can prepare the property transaction contract in English.



3. When renting a house

Lease on Deposit Basis (Deposit System)	You sign a 1-2 year lease contract and pay the deposit in advance. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> After the end of the contract, the deposit must be returned in full. At the time of the contract, 10% of the deposit is paid as a down payment. (Pay the balance when you move in)
Monthly Rent	You sign a 1-2 year lease contract, pay a fixed deposit and pay monthly rent. (The deposit is about 10 to 20 times the monthly rent) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At the time of the contract, 10% of the deposit is paid as a down payment. Pay the balance and a month's rent in advance when you move in. In principle, the deposit is fully returned after the contract is terminated. Still, the deposit minus the corresponding amount is returned under particular circumstances, such as a delay in monthly rent.

WEATHER

Located in the middle of the Korean peninsula and facing the West Sea, Incheon shows both continental and maritime climates. The lowest recorded temperature in Incheon was -21.0°C (-5.8°F), and the highest was 38.9°C (102.02°F). The average temperature is 12.1°C (53.78 °F), 0.7°C lower than that of Seoul.


LOCATION

In the geographic coordinate system, Incheon is located at 126°37' East and 37°28' North. It is located in the middle of the Korean Peninsula, downstream of the Hangang River, facing the Yellow Sea. Incheon is located 28km away from Seoul, the capital of the Republic of Korea, and at a latitude similar to that of San Francisco, Washington, and southern Spain.

TOTAL AREA

Incheon was 201.21 km² when it was promoted into a city directly under the direct control of the central government in 1981. Later it expanded to 310.83 km² by incorporating Gyeyang-myeon, Gimpo-gun, and Yeongjonggyongyu-myeon in Ongjin-gun in 1989. It grew to 955 km² as it became a metropolitan city in 1995 and incorporated Ganghwa-gun, Ongjin-gun, and Geomdan-myeon in Gimpo-gun. It has reached 1,066.46 km² since December 31, 2021, due to landfills since 2000. It boasts the largest area among the eight major cities in Korea.

TERRAIN

The mountainous areas of Incheon are hilly areas within 300m above sea level, except for about ten mountains, including Marisan Mountain (469m), Gyeyangsan Mountain (395m), and Samgaksan Mountain (343m), with no significant river development. Incheon has a rias coast, a long and complicated coastline with 168 islands, of which 128 are uninhabited.

LIFE AND POPULATION

Incheon comprises two counties: Ganghwa-gun and Ongjin-gun, and eight boroughs: Jung-gu, Dong-gu, Michuhol-gu, Yeonsu-gu, Namdong-gu, Bupyeong-gu, Gyeyang-gu, and Seo-gu. The population of Incheon is approximately three million which makes it the third largest city in Korea by population next to Seoul and Busan. Currently, 66,364 foreigners live in Incheon. (December 2021, based on the Republic of Korea Public Data Portal)



Using a Medical Institution

Using Primary Care

- 1 Submit your health insurance card or identification card at the reception/payment counter and wait.
- 2 When your name is called, go into the examination room and tell the doctor about your condition.
- 3 Ask questions about the doctor's directions.
- 4 After examination, pay for examination/treatment and receive a prescription.
- 5 Go to a pharmacy near the hospital, give a prescription, and purchase medicine.

Using Secondary Care

- 1 Receive a medical treatment request from a primary care medical institution.
- 2 Submit your health insurance card and the medical treatment request from the primary care medical institution.
- 3 Go to the relevant department and receive treatment.
- 4 Receive a prescription and make an appointment for the next treatment, if necessary.
- 5 Pay for examination/treatment at the payment counter.

- ※ For prescription drugs, you must submit a doctor's prescription at a pharmacy.
- ※ Over-the-counter medicines (digestive, painkillers, nutritional supplements, etc.) can be purchased at pharmacies or convenience stores without a doctor's prescription.

Concert opera <RIGOLETTO>





I-VISION Center, Opening on Weekends

The I-VISION Center on the 33rd floor of the G-Tower is reopening on the weekends from November 19. The I-VISION Center was closed due to COVID-19 but reopened on weekdays in early May. It is popular among citizens as you can see the development of IFEZ at a glance, along with its panoramic view, which includes Songdo Central Park and the Incheon Bridge. It is open from 10:00 a.m. to 5:50 p.m. on weekdays and from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on weekends. However, the center is closed on Mondays for facility and equipment inspections.

Incheon Provides Safe Home Set to Single Female Households for Crime Prevention



Incheon provides safe home sets for security to single female households and stores to expand safe unmanned delivery services. Security items (spare keys, door open sensors, portable emergency bells) are provided to 100 low-income single female households and 100 small stores. Incheon plans to select one or two counties and boroughs next year to conduct a pilot project and expand it to all counties and boroughs after evaluation. In addition, for the

safe unmanned delivery service currently operated at 70 locations, the service will be operated in five to six new additional locations next year.

Korea's First 'Smart Convergence Manufacturing Support Center' Opens in Namdong Industrial Complex in Incheon



A support center to lead the smart convergence industry opened in Namdong Industrial Complex in Incheon. It is 3,524 m² (approximately 1,066 pyeong) with one basement floor and nine aboveground floors. It has test rooms, training rooms, offices, lounges, etc. There is also an open lab with equipment used in the fields of EMC, wireless testing, and video security performance test evaluation. The support

center is part of the 'Manufacturing Sector Eco-Friendly Management Infrastructure Development Project,' which was selected for a public contest by the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy last year and is currently in progress. By 2025, a total of 23.9 billion won will be invested in support centers across the country's three regions (metropolitan, southeastern, and southwestern).
