On January 1, 1883, Jemulpo Port (the old name of Incheon Port) opened. 2023 marks the 140th anniversary of the opening of Incheon Port.

#1 Birth of a Gateway to the World

Incheon started to exchange with foreign countries after Incheon Port opened in 1883. The area around Incheon Port proliferated by trading materials and human resources. Because it was a gateway to the world, Incheon Port became the central place of Korea in trade and economy, with a painful history of the 'exploitation by Japanese imperialism' behind it. This turbulent period became the cornerstone for the modernization of Korea and left various architectural and cultural heritages behind.

#2 'First' Records Left by Modernization

Due to rapid modernization, Incheon Port has set numerous records of "firsts" in a short period. As it is said that history remains even as time passes, there are records of the open port that contain the traces of those days. Places like banks, concessions, parks, and hotels that we can access easily in daily life today were introduced for the first time in Korea. With these moments together, Incheon gained the strength to overcome its painful history and advance into the best city.

RECORD 1.

Korea's First Western-style Park Jayu Park

Jayu Park, developed in Eungbongsan Mountain in 1888, was located within the mutual concession of various countries and was called Gukguk Park in the beginning. With a well-developed trail on the broad site, it is famous for family outings and cherry blossom viewing. You can see Incheon Port from the top.

Korea's First Foreigners Social Club Jemulpo Gurakbu (Jemulpo Club)

Jemulpo Gurakbu(Jemulpo Club), well known as the filming location of the drama <Goblin>, started in 1891 during the port opening period. It has become an exhibition and cultural space that citizens can access freely. It operates various programs, such as humanities education and special shows.

Incheon's First Catholic Church Dapdong Cathedral

In 1889, Father Wilhelm founded Jemulpo Catholic Church (now Dapdong Catholic Church). The building harmoniously combines Gothic and Romanesque styles. It is recognized for its aesthetic and historical value with its splendid glass windows, coved ceilings, and red bricks.

#1 Jemulpo Renaissance Taking off with Wings

The 'Jemulpo Renaissance' project hit its stride to revitalize Incheon Port, which has a long history. The rebirth of the port, which has enormous significance in terms of location and history, will bring great value in many ways. In addition, Incheon will earnestly promote the construction of Incheon Line 3 to ensure the balanced development of the old city center and bring convenience to citizens.

#2 Open Port Area Embracing Culture, into the Arms of Citizens

The Jemulpo Renaissance Project's ultimate goal is all about 'citizens.' Various spaces to enjoy the culture and a skywalk will be constructed in the Incheon inner port area. Citizen festivals will be held to promote communication with people regularly. The open port area will promote tour packages that use the history and culture of the port opening period. Through this, Incheon Port will open for the second time in terms of culture and settle in the daily life of citizens.

The PR center is quite fruitful as it covers various content, from Incheon Port's history to the redevelopment project. On three floors, it has a photo zone, exhibition space, multi-purpose room, and the PR space for the redevelopment, providing a variety of attractions.

Asia's largest grain warehouse, located at Pier 8 of Incheon Port, is under remodeling into a cultural space for citizens. Cultural spaces such as a large media art exhibition hall and a video studio will provide various experiences.

[PORT CITY] on Records

Incheon Port celebrates its 140th anniversary this year. After the opening of the port, the area has grown into an 'international port city' and has made excellent records. Let's take a look at the story of the Open Port Area that embraces Incheon Port, Jung-gu, and Dong-gu through INFO.

Korea's Economic Growth Engine, 'Incheon Port'

Incheon Port, the center of logistics in the capital area, has handled a huge part of the cargo volume for a long time, acting as a window for the port opening and an engine for Korea's economic development. Recently, it has promoted the 'Incheon Inner Port Pier 1 and 8 Redevelopment Project' in phases to increase the vitality of the economy and living by connecting the Incheon Inner Port with the old city center.

'Incheon Port Lock Gates', Yielding Rapid Growth of the Trading Industry

The 'Incheon Port Lock Gates,' introduced for the first time over a century ago, keep the water depth at a constant level to ensure stable loading and unloading on ships that enter the inner port. After installing the lock gates, Incheon Port became a hub for international trade.

KOREA'S FIRST, INCHEON'S BEST Found in the Open Port Area

The 'Incheon City History Museum' selected 100 major cultural heritages of Incheon and published 'Korea's First, Incheon's Best 100' in 2015. Let's look at the valuable cultural heritage of the open port area that surprised Korea and the world.

'Korea's First' Records

1882 #Western Powers #First Treaty

Treaty Signing Place

On April 6, 1882 (May 22 by the solar calendar), the United States-Korea Treaty was signed at Jemulpo.



1883 #Korea's First Maritime Customs

Incheon Maritime Customs

The Incheon Maritime Customs began to collect taxes on June 16, 1883, and make comprehensive coastal weather observations in January 1884.



1883 #Korea's First Foreigners' Cemetery

Incheon Foreigners' Cemetery

It is a foreigners' cemetery constructed at 1, Bukseong-dong 1-ga, and the first burial was in November 1885. It was for an American, Joseph Timmons.



1883 #Korea's First Western House

Company House of Sechang Corporation

This is a dormitory where three employees from Hamburg, Germany, stayed. They came to establish a trading company in 1883.



1888 #Korea's First Western-style Park

Gakguk Park

After the opening of Incheon Port, the first Western-style modern park was constructed based on the design of a Russian surveyor, Sabatin.



1899 #Korea's First Railroad

Seoul-Incheon Railroad Line

The Gyeongin Line (Seoul-Incheon Railroad Line) is Korea's first railroad, opened in 1899. At the time, the Gyeongin Line made two round trips daily with four steam locomotives and seven stations.



Registration of 'Tangible Cultural Properties'

1890 #Tangible Cultural Property #No.50

The 18th Bank of Japan (Currently Modern Architecture Museum)

The 18th Bank of Japan, with its headquarters in Nagaka, Japan, established its first overseas branch in Incheon in 1890 to cope with increasing trade with Incheon.



1892 #Tangible Cultural Property #No.39

Yeonghwa Hakdang

Yeonghwa Hakdang is a Western-style institution for elementary education established in 1892. The building, with the remaining part of the original Yeonghwa Hakdang, was designated as a tangible cultural property on April 2, 2001.



1908 #Tangible Cultural Property #No.49

Hongyemun Gate

It is an arched stone gate constructed by cutting the top of Eungbongsan Mountain. It is a cultural property that shows the civil engineering methods during the Japanese colonial period.



1949 #Tangible Cultural Property #No.8

Post Office

In August 1949, following the liberation, the Incheon Post Network became the 'Incheon Post Office.' It still serves as a post office and is Korea's best and first post office.

Q

The 'Cultural Heritage Night Tour' to enjoy a historical walk with lights that embroider the night is receiving a dynamic response. We wonder what the effect of the festival is.

A

'Incheon Open Port Cultural Heritage Night Tour' is Incheon's representative festival, visited by around 100,000 tourists. It will be held for the eighth time this year. The cultural heritage night tour was initially the Cultural Heritage Administration's project. The prime purpose is to provide a chance to enjoy culture by opening various tangible and intangible heritages to citizens. The festival is anticipated by tourists, merchants, and residents of the open port. It is becoming a festival enjoyed by tourists and local residents, and merchants directly promoting

snacks, souvenirs, and experiences during the festival.

This year, it will be held in August and October. In particular, as Incheon was selected as Korea's first 'Night Tourism City' at the end of last year, this year's night tour will be expanded to include the opening of media art and cultural heritages at night and coupon events. We ask for your interest and participation in the 'Open Port Cultural Heritage Night Tour,' filled with things to see and enjoy.

'OPEN PORT', A TOURIST ATTRACTION WITH THE HISTORY OF PORT OPENING

Q

**Open port left various historical and cultural products.
What is the value of historical space as a tourist destination?**

A

The historical space shows us the cultural characteristics, lifestyles, and industries of the time. Tourists can directly experience the history on the spot, better understand the region, and have an indirect experience feeling as if they went back to that time in history. In particular, the open port is a place that many students visit through family and school trips because it carries a great

significance for education, learning about history through various cultural heritages of the open port. This year, Incheon Tourism Organization plans to attract more field studies and school excursions in line with the easing of the response to COVID-19. We also plan to earnestly cooperate with the Jung-gu Office, which includes the opening port.

STRENGTH THAT BUILT 'SMART TOURISM CITY' I

Q

Incheon is the first 'Smart Tourism City,' and its mobile app 'Incheon Easy' is drawing a lot of attention. Could you please explain this?

A

'Incheon Easy' is a tourism platform created when the open port area was selected as the first target for the 'Smart Tourism City Development Project' by the Ministry of Culture, Sports and Tourism in 2020. With nine private consortium companies, we developed all services necessary for tourism, such as travel recommendation, payment, and mobility, in a single app. At the time, 'independent travel (personalized travel)' drew attention due to COVID-19,

and its value was recognized even further. 'Incheon Easy' introduces various local tourism information through collaboration with local creators. In particular, the Theme Path Service recommends a path that suits the taste of the tourist. We intend to continuously discover theme courses within the open port and hold on-site events in connection with them to create 'connected' content that allows tourists to watch content and visit and enjoy the open port.

Q

'Incheon Easy' provides a vivid tour of the open port through AR/VR technology. We wonder what value of the open port you paid attention to.

A

If you press the 'Time Travel' menu of the Incheon Easy app, you can have a vivid historical experience of a lost past at the open port using AR/VR technology. In 'AR Ghost Docent Service,' historical figures appear in AR and explain places. It is the most popular content among tourists.

Open Port is where various cultures were introduced through Incheon Port in 1883. It has multiple storytelling elements that boast being Korea's first. In the past, cultural commentators explained the significance of a place directly. Today, 'Incheon Easy' lets you enjoy the open port more charmingly because Sir. Kim Gu will appear before you and explain the history when you touch the mobile phone.

INCHEON TOURISM ORGANIZATION'S BLUEPRINT AFTER COVID-19

Q

It is expected that tourism in Incheon will also revive gradually. Could you tell us about Incheon Tourism Organization's 'Vision for Tourism Marketing'?

A

This year, we expected that the tourism demand would rise noticeably following the calming down of the endemic. To facilitate the revitalization of the local economy through tourism, Incheon Tourism Organization will ① discover and foster Incheon's unique tourism content, ② engage in strategic promotion and marketing in response to the changed domestic and international tourism markets, ③ improve accommodation conditions to create a comfortable and convenient tourism environment, and ④ realize sustainable Incheon tourism based on social responsibility. We plan to promote these four as core strategic projects.

Following the mitigation of COVID-19, traveling has emerged as a trend. By following the latest travel trends, we will concentrate on activating the 'Ganghwa Stay' program and workcation, fostering 'Incheon Ecotourism Village,' and attracting school trips for domestic marketing. In addition, as the 'Night Tour Specialized City,' we plan to develop various content, including drone shows, performances, and festivals incorporating media art and emphasizing Incheon's characteristic of being 'Korea's First.' The main targets of these plans are Songdo Central Park, Wolmido Island, and the Open Port area. You will be able to feel many changes from this year.

A space with forest and culture, Madelim

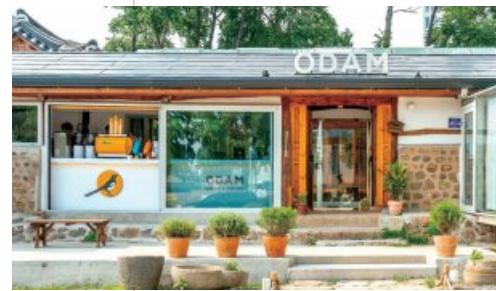
Last January, a new hot place emerged in Jung-gu, Incheon. Madelim is a cafe renovated from Wangsan Church, which is 120 years old. From the interior to the menu, everything was thought out carefully. It is located on Yongyudo Island and is close to tourist attractions such as Eurwangni and Wangsan Beaches. It is also close to Incheon International Airport that it is great to stop by before or after entering or leaving the country.

The cafe's name, 'Madelim,' coined by combining 'Made' and 'Lim (Forest),' means 'meeting a forest in Incheon.' From the first basement to the fourth floor, the cafe is decorated with a nature theme, such as earth, light, water, sky, and a garden. A single space embraces various moods, from a green forest to a dark cave. Visitors keep coming the cafe as they can enjoy everything in one space, from coffee and bakery to dining, exhibitions, and jazz performances.

'ODAM,' renovated from an old house built in 1715, keeps the warm traces of people that lived there, such as the signboard and records of historical materials, as many as its history. A plaque with 'Gwanhaegak Pavilion' written on it, the old name of the building, indicates that its history began in the Joseon Dynasty

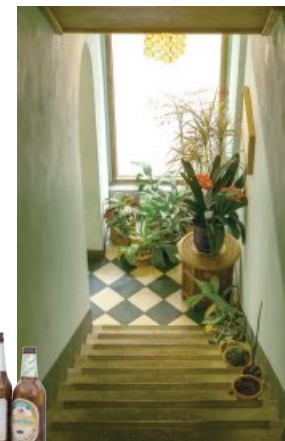

Vietnam

Vietnam is one of the most popular travel destinations in Southeast Asia, preferred by Koreans. Vietnam is a tropical country, but the climate differs in each region because it is extended from south to north. It is a unique country where most of the population is Vietnamese, but there are also 53 ethnic minorities. Incheon has established a sisterhood relationship with Haiphong.

FIRST ENCOUNTER WITH INCHEON, THE GAEHANGNO PROJECT

It was in September 2018 when Mekongsarong settled down in Incheon. It had started in another area but had to give up due to gentrification. At the time, Kim, the owner, began his relationship with Incheon when he heard about the 'Gaehangno Project,' which allowed stores to keep their values in one place without leaving the region. "Mekongsarong aims for a long-lasting, long-established store. I participated in the Gaehangno Project because I thought that coexistence was important for local residents, merchants, and the streets. Being part of the street, I want Mekongsarong to coexist here for a long time."

메콩사롱이 인천에 자리를 잡은 것은 2018년 9월. 다른 지역에서 시작했지만 젠트리피케이션으로 인해 가게 운영을 포기해야 했다. 당시 김기창 대표는 지역을 떠나지 않고 한 자리에서 가치를 이어갈 수 있는 '개항로 프로젝트'를 접하며 인천과의 연을 시작했다. "메콩사롱은 '오래가도 질리지 않는 노포'를 지향하고 있어요. 개항로 프로젝트에 참여했던 것도 지역 주민과 상인, 그리고 거리가 함께 상생하는 것이 중요하다고 생각했기 때문인데요. 거리의 한 사람으로서, 이곳에서 오래도록 공존하고 싶습니다."

AS GOOD AS GOING TO SOUTHEAST ASIA

Mekongsarong, a two-story store, provides a cozy atmosphere with plants that fill the space and the wooden interior. The interior was the part that took a lot of effort and time when remodeling the building. Focusing on giving the "feeling of Southeast Asia," it combined the vibes of three countries, Vietnam, Indonesia (Bali), and Thailand. Since it is an old building, many spots needed repair. Still, it was carefully renovated to give customers an extraordinary experience as if they were visiting Southeast Asia.

BRINGING OUT THE TASTE OF VIETNAM, HEALTHILY WITHOUT STIMULATION

For it serves Vietnamese food, it uses spices and other ingredients that are unfamiliar to Koreans. It was also a tricky part when developing the recipe at first. The proportions of the ingredients were adjusted through trial and error and with the help of friends. In this process, the owner, Kim, had the philosophy of making food not too stimulating. His sincerity and reasonable effort resulted in success. Many customers have given favorable reviews, saying that the food tastes just like the one they had in Vietnam. The store still has many regular customers.

베트남 음식을 판매하기에 향신료 등 한국인의 입맛에 익숙지 않은 식재료가 포함된다. 이는 처음 레시피를 구성할 때 어려운 지점이기도 했다. 여러 시행착오를 거치고, 주변 지인의 도움도 받으면서 재료의 비율을 조절했다. 이 과정에서 김 대표에게 자극적이지 않은 음식을 만들겠다는 철학이 생겼다. 그의 정성과 노력은 성공적인 결과를 가져왔다. 많은 손님이 '현지에서 맛본 맛'이라는 호평을 남겼고, 현재도 많은 단골의 발걸음이 이어지고 있다.

Q. COULD YOU BRIEFLY INTRODUCE MEKONGSARONG?

I coined the name, Mekongsarong, by combining 'Mekong River' in the Indochina Peninsula and the 'sarong' worn by men in Indonesia and Malaysia, in the sense of merging the two cultures. Customers can enjoy the taste and atmosphere of Southeast Asia comfortably in an exotic space.

Q. WHAT ARE THE SIGNATURE MENUS OF MEKONGSARONG?

Our signature menus include 'bun cha' and 'banh mi,' characterized by a non-stimulating or sweet taste. I had a lot of concerns because I was offering food from a different culture. But I adjusted the flavor to suit Korean customers while using local Vietnamese recipes. I could create a unique taste for Mekongsarong.

Q. WHAT MOTIVATED YOU TO SELL VIETNAMESE FOOD?

I was involved in business activities dealing with furniture production and vintage goods importing from Vietnam and Indonesia. I started running the restaurant because I wanted to introduce the food and culture I experienced at the time to Korea in my way.

Q. PLEASE SAY SOMETHING TO YOUR CUSTOMERS AND READERS OF <INCHEON NOW>.

Our ultimate goal is to serve delicious dishes to our customers. We will always work hard to offer the best taste ever. We hope to catch your attention in the future.

INCHEON REOPENS WITH ADB

Incheon would host the 53rd Annual Meeting of the Asian Development Bank in 2020, but because of COVID-19, the meeting was held virtually. It was decided that Incheon should host the 56th meeting in 2023. The Annual Meeting of the Asian Development Bank will be held over four days from May 2 to 5, under the theme of "Rebounding Asia: Recover, Reconnect, and Reform." It is expected to strengthen economic cooperation between countries discontinued due to the pandemic and become an opportunity for exchanges, discussing Asia's economic recovery and sustainable future.



PROMOTING INCHEON'S COMPETITIVENESS WORLDWIDE

The '56th Annual Meeting of the Asian Development Bank' is expected to be the largest ever since 5,000 people from 68 countries will participate. Finance ministers and heads of central banks of member countries, international organizations, media, academia, finance, and NGOs will discuss common goals, such as developing future industries in the Asia-Pacific region and overall ADB operation. Participants will be given opportunities to exchange freely through seminars and business consultations on various topics, such as financial services, high-tech industries, marine/aviation, and cultural tourism.

In addition, Incheon operates a publicity center in the hallway in front of the exhibition hall on the first floor of Songdo Convensia to promote Incheon's key policies and projects, such as fostering future strategic industries, and promoting Incheon's tourism and MICE competitiveness, such as Unique Venue, to demonstrate its capabilities as a renowned international city (global city).

+ WHAT IS "ADB"?

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) was established in 1966 to support economic and social development in the Asia-Pacific region. It is leading various activities for the development of member countries, such as promoting development fund investments and loans in the Asia-Pacific region, establishing and implementing development policies, technical assistance, and cooperation with international organizations. The Annual Meeting of the Asian Development Bank is the highest decision-making body of ADB and a global event participated by delegations from member countries, international organizations, significant domestic and foreign public institutions, companies, and media officials.

Two Steps for the Advancement of the Hydrogen Economy in Incheon

Incheon is becoming a key city for Korea's hydrogen economy. On February 22, Incheon held the '2023 Incheon Liquefied Hydrogen Forum' at Songdo Convensia and shared directions for revitalizing the liquefied hydrogen economy by expanding hydrogen vehicles and the related policy efforts. At the forum, Incheon promoted active cooperation with the central and local governments and relevant organizations to lead the hydrogen economy.

STEP 1

Hydrogen Bus Leading City Development Execution Agreement :
Initiating hydrogen mobility

A hydrogen high-floor bus test-drive ceremony was held in Incheon prior to the opening of the forum. Officials boarded the 'Universe FCEV' and experienced a convenient and economical hydrogen bus. It produces less noise and vibration than regular buses, with a comfortable riding experience. About 79 tons of greenhouse gases can be reduced annually, with each hydrogen bus replacing a natural gas (CNG) bus. This year, Incheon introduced four hydrogen high-floor buses. In January, 'Shinbaekseung Tour' introduced one hydrogen high-floor bus for the first time in Korea. 'Mani Transportation' introduced three hydrogen high-floor buses and started operating them between Incheon Bus Terminal and Seoul Station. In addition, hydrogen stations will be expanded from the current six to 14 this year to help the smooth operation of hydrogen-based public transportation.

STEP 2

Business Agreement for Eco-friendly Airport Infrastructure :
Establishing a hydrogen transportation complex at Incheon International Airport T2

Incheon International Airport is becoming more eco-friendly with a large-scale liquid hydrogen charging infrastructure. Incheon has signed a 'business agreement for establishing eco-friendly airport infrastructure' with the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, and Transport, Incheon International Airport Corporation, SK Plug Hyverse, and Korea Gas Technology Corporation. The agreement is mainly about building a hydrogen transportation complex at Incheon International Airport Terminal 2 (T2) and promoting the transition into hydrogen mobility. Since November last year, the business model has taken shape through continuous working-level consultations. It was finally selected after participating in a public contest by the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport in January. Incheon International Airport is visited by various types of mobility, such as long-distance buses, including airport buses and commuter buses, and trucks and forklifts. The establishment of hydrogen infrastructure is expected to achieve visible carbon reduction effects.

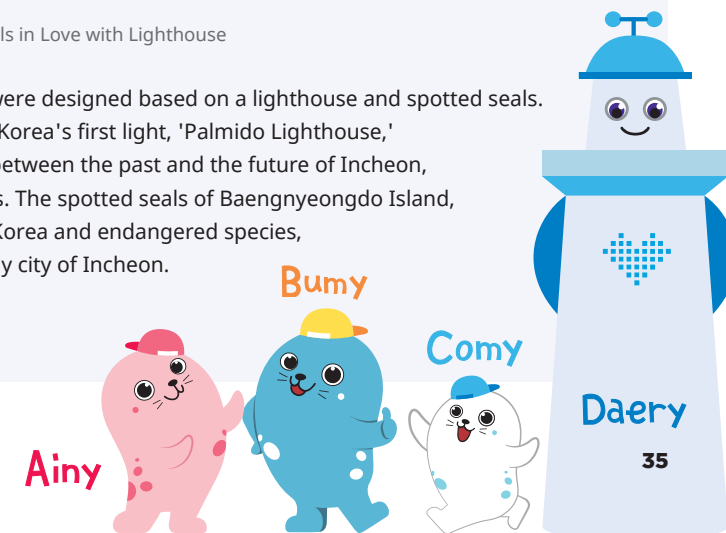

Incheon and Siheung, Rediscussing Baegot Bridge Strategic Environmental Impact Assessment



Incheon will put heads together with Siheung to solve the problems related to the construction of Baegot Bridge, particularly the controversy over environmental damage. Following discussions on the 'Baegot Bridge Strategic Environmental Impact Assessment' of the Ministry of Environment, the two cities agreed to supplement the Songdo tidal flat wetland area damaged by the Baegot Bridge construction with the Siheung tidal flat wetland area. Incheon and Siheung plan to operate a four-party consultative body involving Incheon, Gyeonggi-do, and the two Free Economic Zone Authorities to minimize environmental damage due to the bridge construction and continue to consult with the Ministry of Environment to promote it as a state project.

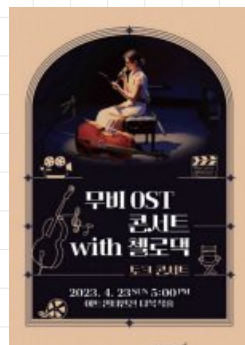


Musical <42nd Street>

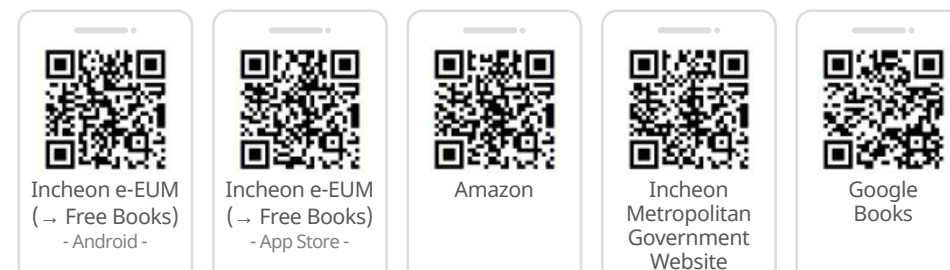
<Incheon Now> became new! I started reading it last year, but it feels like the content of the column and the design have become more diverse. It will be fun to read. :)
